HILL'S ATTITUDE.

David B. Hill was in some respects to the Democratic National Convention what Roosevelt was to the Republican National Convention, but the result was different. Hill did not want the Vice-Presidential nomination and refused to take it, being finally forced to stem the tide by a strong personal appeal to the convention, which convinced the great gathering of the sincerity of his refusal. Hill has other fish to fry in New York State. Roosevelt was averse to taking the Republican nomination, but he was, however, in thorough accord with the party leader and platform and would never agree to decline the nomination were it given him. Like Hill, Roosevelt had other plans in store for himself, but he was willing to forego them for party's sake, for he could do so with absolute consistency. Hill was the popular idol at Kansas City, as Roosevelt was at Philadelphia, although Croker and others among the New York leaders had knives out for him, as Platt did for the Rough Rider. They wanted to rid themselves of him, as the New York Republican machine desired to eliminate the hero of San Juan hill by caging him in the Vice-Presi-

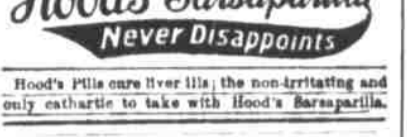

He is an astute politician. He well knew that for him to have taken second place on the ticket with Bryan would have meant his own political sacrifice in the East. He was aware that such a ticket would have been incompatible because of his attitude in 1896. He was placed in a trying position and a man with less nerve and less regard for popular clamor would have been swept from his feet. Although he was humiliated in the New York delegation the popular tribute paid him on all sides was something for him to be proud of. It was a just recognition of his past services, as a leader of Eastern Democrats and a mark of confidence in his political strength.
