SUMMON CONGRESS.

Lapse of time brings no solution of the difficulties of the Chinese problem. On the contrary the situation grows more and more disquieting. The international demonstration at Tien Tsai has obviously failed of its purpose to secure the release of the foreigners in Peking and the powers are face to face with the issue that has been foreseen from the first, of war against the forces of the Chinese Empire.

The President and his Cabinet have persistently nured the hope which scarcely any one else has entertained, that the Chinese would yield to a display of force and open communication with the legations. They have not done so. In spite of the amiable Mr. Wu, the present attitude of those who control the Chinese Government is one of defiance. Diplomacy is at a standstill. Unless the outside powers yield their demands, the next step must be war.

The President ought not to attempt to decide this momentous issue alone. He has not the lawful right and he has not the actual power to go further.

The little that we can learn of the military situation is ground for the gravest anxiety.

There evidently is not a hearty co-operation among the forces at Tien Tsai, and their sufficiency to cope with the opposition they will meet is more than doubtful.

While success might justify the stretch of executive authority, any disaster at the outset would throw an awful responsibility upon the President and his advisers.

His only safety is in obedience to the Constitution, under which, as was said by a great Secretary of State in a similar emergency, "the executive branch of this government is not the war-making power. The exercise of that great attribute of sovereignty is vested in Congress, and the President has no authority to order aggressive hostilities to be undertaken."
