## WOMEN ABROAD.

American women are noted throughout this country for their beauty and accomplishments, but so far as the Paris Exposition they fell short, in many respects, of standards of learning set by French and German women.

It was a lamentable thing that so many of our women were unable to speak French. And this was a great need of that accomplishment in view of the various meetings held for the purpose of furthering plans for the advancement of woman's cause throughout the world.

Our women rivaled all in grace and elegance, but they were surpassed in courtesy by the French in learning, the Germans, and in organizing power by the English ladies.

Indeed, I think the example set by all these regards will exert a lasting influence on American women.

The number of school teachers at the Exposition was enormous, and I had seen their earnings for a day, and taken advantage of opportunities which included in a month's visit to Paris, a trip to the lakes of Switzerland.

They were visible everywhere, and when we were unacquainted with the most exclusive social circles, presented. Such women as Mrs. May Wright Sewall gave up all the time of their delivery of long important address in French before a large audience, and surprised us all by the correctness of her pronunciation and the fluency of her manner.

Most of our women have a good superficial knowledge of either French, Italian and German, and I imagine that with it they can carry on a connected conversation.

It was noticeable, however, that our women in a variety of other cases had good command of English.

### England's State Prisoners.
