SIZE OF THE COTTON CROP.

Experts sill di agree as to the size of the cotton crop. Some say it will go to 10,250,000 la'es while ofters say it will not exceed 9.250,000. The extremes are million bal s apart. Ta ent rarely is unanimous, and never so over the size of a cotton crop. The McFaddens of Philade phia and other bears will continue to predict a big outcome, but the weight of opinion is against them.

Toking one year with another i is seen that just about one half of the crop is marketed by December 1, and if we use this as a basis this year, we find that the crop will be 9,600,000 bales; and this is as good an estimate, or ra her calculation, as can be made at present. There are some who believe high prices have hurried the crop to market, and that over one half of it had been marketed by December 1. In 1896 there was marketed at the close of November 54 83 per cent. It is therefore possible that the crop will not turn out to be 9,600 000 bales. It is best to take that aggregate as a maximum.

Such a crop is below consumption. It would be far below consumption if the diplomats had not managed to close China another year to the cotton goods trade. Thure seems to be no limit to the delays they are able to cheate But even if China be wholly and alto gether dropped from the problem cotton should, and undoubedly will, cross the 10-cent mark, and next year.
