THE AMERICAN CAPITAL.

The celebration of the one hundredth anniversary of the founding of the city of Washington last week was a notable event from many points of view. Though a great historical occasion, it was turned by the people of that city to practical account by utilizing it for the inauguration of a movement to secure a new million-dollar White House, a government hall of records and other improvements of which the seat of government stands in need.

Senator Hoar's comparison of Washington with the great capitals of Europe was one of the striking features of the centennial exercises. London, he said, had been a center of civilization for more than 1,200 years. Paris had been the seat of government for a century longer. Berlin dated back 400 years and Vienna 77. Yet with the Capitol, the monument and the Congressional Library, the American city need fear comparison with the architectural work of any single century in the ancient capitals.

The city's rise has been no more marvelous than the country's advance from an insignificant group of petty States to the leadership among the world powers.

The Kansas City Star recalls the fact that when John Adams and his cabinet rode to the new seat of government in "coach, chaises and upon horse back," in the late autumn of 1800, the United States had a population of 5,000,000 people. Alexander Hamilton had rescued its credit from utter ruin, but it had no army or navy worthy of the name, its trade was insignificant, its manufactures hardly to be reckoned. Means of communication were deficient, and its people were scattered along such a stretch of coast as to prevent close unity of feeling or of action. France, the ally in the Revolution, locked on the country with a feeling of disdain, which was shared by the other powers of Europe. If Australia should declare its independence to-day its position in the family of nations would be more honorable than that of the United States a century ago. It is well that there should be an occasional celebration of a National anniversary to make the country pause for a moment to see what it has attained.
