## POOR LITTLE DELEWARE.

For the first time in the history of the United States a state is without representation in the senate and will be so for two years at least. It is poor little Delaware. She has had only one senator for four years past and his term expired last week. The legislature which recently adjourned sine die was to elect two senators, but failed to elect any.

It will be two years before another legislature will meet and as the legislature had an opportunity to elect the governor cannot fill the senatorial vacancies.

The Republicans had a majority in both houses of the late legislature, but were divided into two factions, the regulars and the Addicks men.

Each refused to vote for any man proposed by the other and the Democrats would vote for the candidate of neither.

Addicks for six years past has been trying to buy his way into the Senate and in the effort has spent a fortune. He has no qualification for the office and many citizens of Delaware had rather be forever unrepresented in the Senate than misrepresented by him.

But there are able and clean Republicans in Delaware and it is a disgrace to the State that two of them were not chosen Senators at the recent legislative session.

Delaware, the home of John M. Clayton, of the noble Bayard, Salisburys and Grays is in a pitiful plight. A gang of boodle Republican politicians have her by the throat and there is none to speak for her in the highest council of the nation.
