## IMPORT DUTIES IN RUSSIA.

A dispatch from St. Petersburg announces that import duties at Vladivostock on all American iron, steel and machinery have been raised. It is scarcely possible that American goods have been discriminated against, and German or British goods favored. This would not be international comity, and the dispatch is misleading in that respect.

The meaning of it is plain. The Russian policy is to build up home manufacturers, and the duties on iron, steel and machinery made elsewhere have been raised. Russian merchants and Russian manufacturers never have been able to compete successfully with the rest of the world, and perhaps never will be. They were readily driven to the wall by the Jews, and they cannot hold their own against either of British or American merchants, and the order recently issued is in accordance with the long established policy of giving them protection at home. The new duties are undoubtedly practically prohibitive.

If Russia continues to hold Manchuria the policy that has been applied at Vladivostock will be applied there also—probably is already in force there. The "open door" that Secretary Hay once claimed to have secured has come to this in the province that took the most American goods. Russia has driven, or soon will drive America out.

True, we cannot logically complain of the Russian policy. The Dingley-McKinley tariff is built on like lines. The Russian tariff cannot really outrun the Dingley scheme for creating trusts and robbing consumers. We must first get rid of the Dingleyism before we can accomplish much in gaining wider markets for American goods. The times are becoming so strong that Dingleyism may have come to stay, and in that case we can only make faces at Russia and grumble over the fate that drives us out of that country, including Manchuria.
