WASHINGTON LETTER
(Special Correspondence.)

If President Roosevelt keeps up his present practice, he will be known in history as the great American enter-tainer. Mrs. Roosevelt must know him well enough by this time to make her breakfast, dinner and luncheon orders ample, for until the time comes she never can tell how many will be round the board over which she presides.

When luncheon-time comes, the president glances around his office and says, "Well, let's all go and have some luncheon," and marches to at the head of the company that happens to be with him, whether it is one man or a dozen. He has had somebody at dinner and usually three or four every night since he has been in the White House. The number at luncheon will average three a day, and there have been a dozen guests at breakfast at various times.

These meals are not formal affairs. The guests go in and take pot luck. The Roosevelt menu is simple. The president believes in plenty of plain food. Usually oysters or clams, a soup, a roast and some simple dessert make the dinner. Sometimes there is an entree and oftentimes some dish like chicken pie. Game is frequently served.

Mrs. Roosevelt is a charming hostess and is never ruffled, even when the president bursts into the dining room at the head of half a dozen guests when there are seats provided for three. She would not be surprised if he came in with twenty, as he will some day without doubt.

Troops For the Philippines.
The Philippine army will be reduced by 10,000 men within the next few months by the expiration of enlistments, and the officials of the war department are making preparations to meet that deficiency by the prompt transfer of troops from the United States.

Final action in that regard awaits only the approval of the secretary of war. Troops and transports are ready to start for the Philippines as soon as he gives the word. It is expected that the first expeditions will start from San Francisco within a few days on the transports Grant and Meade and that more troops will be forwarded later from New York by way of the Suez canal on the transport Crook.

The reductions will be gradual and will be met from time to time by fresh troops as required. These arrangements are predicated on the belief that it will be necessary to maintain the Philippine army at its present strength of about 40,000 men for some time to come.

No Cabinet Changes Now.
According to one who claims to know what he is talking about, those enterprising gentlemen of the press who are tearing President Roosevelt's cabinet to pieces and building up a new one for him may save themselves a deal of trouble if they will only stick to facts. No cabinet changes are contemplated at the present time or in the near future. What may occur months or years hence is not worth speculating about. It is true there has been a little anxiety concerning the health of Secretary Root. For several months Mr. Root has not been well. He has been troubled with many boils and carbuncles, and his blood has evidently been in bad condition. The secretary has been in such a state that he has all right if matters turned for the better and all wrong if they turned for the worse. Fortunately, they have turned for the better.

Additions to the Capitol.
Further additions to the United States capitol are suggested by the annual report of the architect, which has been made public at the department of the interior. This report for the last fiscal year not only reviews the marked changes which have been made in the historic structure during the last year or two and gives a list of the various statues and objects of art in the building, but proposes that a new building be secured or erected at a little distance, something on the order of the Malby building for the senate apparently, in which members of the house can have their offices and in which can be located the lighting and heating plants for the capitol.

The New Knox Home.
Mrs. Knox, wife of the attorney general, and her daughter, Miss Rebecca Knox, have arrived in Washington and taken up their residence at their new home in K street, which was the former home of Mrs. Childs of Philadelphia. The stables of the attorney general have been enlarged, and the house is undergoing the most careful changes and is being superbly equipped for social entertainments.

Washington society expects much of the attorney general and his agreeable family, and, though neither Mrs. Knox nor her daughter are fond of the mad whirl of social affairs, their house undoubtedly will be the center of attraction for the young folks of the official set.

Water For Fighting Fire.
The District commissioners have decided to place in their forthcoming estimates to congress an item for \$500,000 which will enable the District authorities to establish what is practically an independent water service for the business section of the city, to be used for fire protection only. The new service will be entirely separate from the other, and special street hydrants will be erected.
