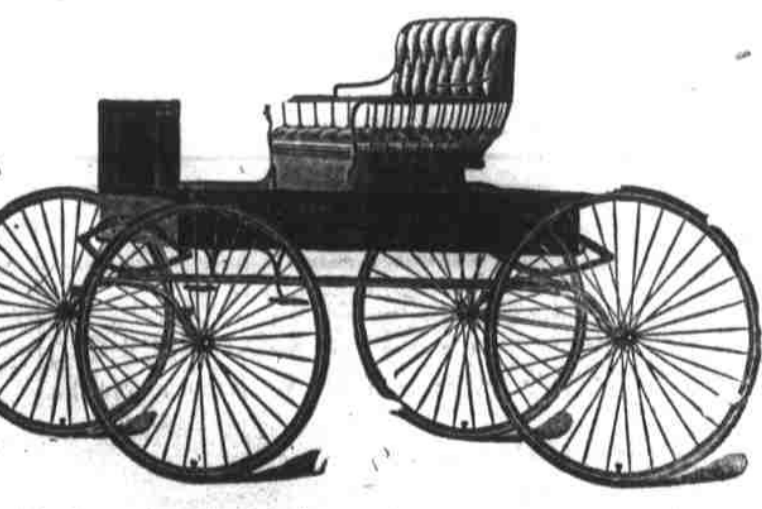

The first sugar manufactured in the country was made in New Orleans in 1726.

More than \$50,000,000 worth of timber was destroyed by forest fires last year.

Thirty thousand troops were recently sent to help the inhabitants subdue a forest fire in Sweden.

In the south of China silkworms have been reared and silk manufactured for over 3,000 years.

During the last ten years 545 miles of irrigation ditches have been opened in Arizona at a cost of \$1,568,403.

It is believed that Nova Scotia will have as many apples as last year and that they will be of a very superior quality.

At the end of the journey from Liverpool to London was dangerous on account of the bad condition of the roads.

Over 800,000 passengers by sea all over the world thirty lose their lives and out of the same number by rail transportation.

Gold has fully \$300,000,000 invested in Central American enterprises and German plantations occupy 740,000 acres.

A plan has been invented to sink shoals and salt islands of Louisiana, and they may become an important salt water center.

England sends \$1,400,000 a year on her imports from Scotland, Ireland and France, while France spends less than \$1,000,000.

In an agricultural country. About 90 per cent of the population are engaged in the cultivation of the soil. This is the only city of any importance.

Quantities of opal were found in Greenland and New South Wales. The latter state the commonest are found in many localities. In the neighborhood of Orange they possess little or no commercial value.
