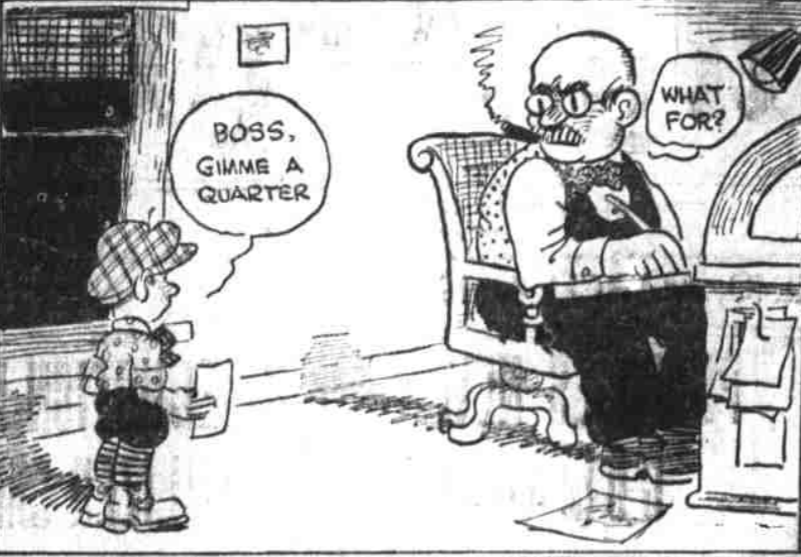
Reducing the Navy
The incapacity of the Republican leadership in Congress is illustrated by the proposal, which seems to be seriously made, to cripple the navy by cutting down its fuel supply and by throwing the Annapolis class back to civil life.

It was for our advantage to reduce the number of our capital ships because four other nations joined us in this. Our naval expenses were reduced, but our relative naval strength was not; in comparison with other nations we retain substantially our naval rank.

The capital ships being reduced, it is of course imperative that the navy retained shall be maintained in the highest state of efficiency. A fleet that cannot go to sea because it lacks fuel will not long be an efficient navy.

The crews can be extemporized pretty rapidly in an emergency, though it should be apparent to anyone that the men cannot be thoroughly efficient until they have had considerable training. But the training involves an abundance of smart young officers. We cannot extemporize them.

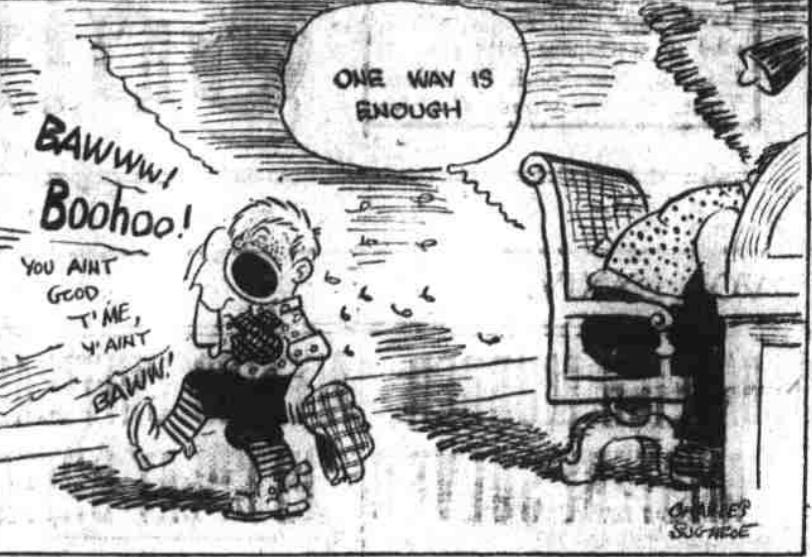
