Yesterday evening the board of directors of Wayne National Sank-Goldsboro's pioneer banking fastitution, that has come up through two generations, promoting, and itself progressing with the growth of Goldsboro, awarded the contract for the erection of a new home-to be erected on the site of the present bank which is to be entirely taken down. brick by brick until not a vestice remains, and the foundations for the new structure will be excavated according to the plans of the new building which is to ocupy the entire lot and to cost in the neighborhood of

The plans of the new hullding are magnificent and are of such giaute detail, symetrical design and frefine ment of expression as to be beyond the reach of the average building con tractor, and therefore it required the successful competitor for the con to have not only scientific know but practical experience in order meet the requirements, and these ements were found combined J. Alfred C. Bossom, of New York, who planned the building, declared last

The building is to be 42 by 105 feet with a foundation sufficient to support a future building 11 stories high, for which plans provide, but is at present to have only two floors exclusive of the mezzanine. The bank will occupy all of the first floor and the mezzanine floor, while the top floor will be occupied by 16 offices, all of which will be outside

haside the bank the lobby will he to feet long, flanked by of teller's ages. All bank offices will be ut the front of the bank, easily accessable, and separated from the lobby by a marble railing.

The back will have two vaults? one strong vault in the hapement and a double vault, one for books and safety deposit boxes and another for funds, all fireproof, and burglar proof. They will be constructed of non-burnable steel. The vault will have a solid steel door seven feet in diameter, and 10 inches Before the ask a man for his thick. In addition to all modern mechanism for automatic timelocking and burglar proof construction, there will be burglar alarm system, so sensitive and ramifying that the slightest untoward contact will result in the sounding of the alarmand that alarm! It can be heard all over the city. Every officer's desk and every service window in the bank will be equiped with an electric button connected with the alarm wires, so that in case of an attempted hold-up the alarm can be given instantly. This alarm tower is, too, so constructed as to work in reverse order. Hence if burglars shall attempt at night to cut the alarm wires on the outside before entering the bank the alarm gong would be set off and continue its calling for an hour and in such tones as to awake the entire city.

The work of construction-to be preluded by the tearing down of the present bank building, is to begin about October 1, and in the mean-
