# Some Deep Sea Creatures Able to Shed a Phosphorescant Light.

The inhabitants of the ocean vary in many respects, according to the depth at which they live, but most of all in their powers of vision. Fish that live at very great depths have either no eyes at all or enormously big ones. There are two methods of getting about in the gloomiest abysses-by delicate or-gans of touch and by sight-that collects the few rays of light due to phosphorescence or other accidental sources.

Many deep sea fish have a curious system of hollows in the skull or about the body which hold a kind of phosphorescent slime. Others have round or oval shining opalescent spots, placed on the head or along the body or tail.

All of them are abundantly supplied with nerves, and they are apparently organs for the production of phosphorescent light. If so, such a fish must swim about surrounded thrown by luminous paint.




