ELECTION RETURNS. REPUBLICAN VICTORY.

Taft Elected by Safe Majority—Caldwell Republican by Small Margin.

"ALMOST A 'LAND-SLIDE.'"

THE results of Tuesday's election, show a greater Republican victory than the first figures indicated. The Charlotte Observer of Wednesday, says:

"The returns constitute a universal surprise. At times during the campaign it appeared exceedingly probable that Mr. Bryan would be elected; for the past two weeks it was manifest to the intelligent and candid observer of events that the election would go to Mr. Taft unless something extraordinary occurred to turn back the tide which had begun to run in his favor; but at no stage of the campaign, up to its very end, had there appeared anything to fore-shadow the Republican landslide which the returns witness."

Late advices show that Mr. Cowles is elected to Congress in this district over Hackett, by 375 to 500 majority and both parties are claiming the 5th and 10th districts. It will probably take the official count to determine these. J. C. Sherrill is elected to the State Senate over J. V. McCall by a small majority.

The County vote is being canvassed as we close our forms. We therefore cannot give the official vote.

It is conceded to be Republican unless irregularities are found in the Globe vote which is being investigated. It is not probable that anything will be found.

Taft gets at least 309 electoral votes which is 67 more than necessary to elect.

The State has gone Democratic by about 35,000.

Mr. Cox, the Republican candidate for Governor is well pleased at the result, as his party has made substantial gains.

Our list of townships is as complete as it is possible to get until the board of canvassers finishes its work.
