Bluefield, W. Va., Oct. 4.-Mathis Beavers, deputy sheriff of McDowell county is dead and Crockett Lowe, fatally wounded as Lenoir Drug Co. the result of a shooting affair at Susanna, this state, last Saturday.

Beavers was shot through the heart while a bullet penetrated Lowe's breast.
