Football has claimed a toll of 30
lives and 216 in
lives and 216 injuries during the Herald up to last Sunday. This is the largest number of deaths re
corded in nine years according to corded in nine years according
the Record Herald figures whi have been kept since 1901. The 30 deaths include eight col and two members of athletic elubs. The injuries were divided among
171 college men, 40 high school 171 college men, 40 high school
players and five from athletic clabs. Twenty-five suffered inter
nal injuries; 19 dislocated anklees, 19 concussion of the braiu and 19 fractured ribs. Fifteen legs and nine arms were broken, while

Point plan is on a modified scale; there being eight, instead lof four commissioners. The affairs of the town are divided under eight heads each conmissioner having a de-
partment of his own. The Enter partment of his own. The Enter-
prise says that the charter creating this form of government restricts the city trom going into debt and
the council can spend no money that is not in band. The commiss.
ion from of government also requires that monthly statements be
published, which gives every citizen in the community an oppor
tunity of seeing just exactly the
condition the city finances are in
all through the administration. Under the commission form the
mayor, if hechooses, has a vote in the council aud it also gives him veto power and he is, strictly
speakiug, supervisor of the entire affairs of the city. He not only
