## SENATOR WAKEFIELD

A most unusual and unique condition, in this year of strange political conditions confronts the people of this the 34th senatorial district. The democrats have virtually nominated Mr. Lawrence Wakefield of Lenoir for State Senator while the republicans last Saturday nominated his brother, Mr. E. F. Wakefield, as his opponent for the same position. This is a singular condition, one that would not occur once in a great number of political campaigns. Some years ago a similar thing happened in Tennessee, when the Taylor brothers, Alf and Bob were candidates on the republican and democratic tickets for Governor. The Taylor brothers made a memorable and able campaign, for the Democrat, winning the election. In the present case the contest will be close, as the district is very close, electing at the last election a democrat and a republican.
