

In a Letter to the Commissioners Endorsing the Movement for County Hospital in Lieu of County Home.

Bethel North Carolina.
July 25th, 1914.

To The Hon. Board of Co., Commissioners,
Greenville, Pitt Co., N. C.
Gentlemen:—

Please allow me to express to your board my hearty support and endorsement of the movement which has been inaugurated to establish a County Hospital in lieu of a County Home.

I am a young man, and have only resided in this County for three years, but in that short time the people and the traditions of Pitt have become very dear to me. I have looked with pride and pleasure on the rapid strides she has made, even in so short a time. The increased opportunity of educational advancement, the magnificent public buildings she has erected, the miles and miles of good roads she has built, her rapid growth in population and material prosperity. These things have made me proud of my County and the reliable conscientious men who have directed us along these lines of advancements. Have we not, however, neglected the question of our Public Health? That issue which is of paramount importance to us all.

Modern methods of sanitation and preventive medicine have put it within our reach to practically wipe out the contagious and infectious diseases that yearly cost us the County thousands of dollars in money and untold values in human life. With a County Hospital and a Whole Time Health Officer these things are entirely within our reach. Malaria Typhoid Fever can be absolutely prevented. Other infectious and contagious diseases can be reduced to a minimum. School children can be examined and minor defects corrected so that they may be able to grasp the opportunity which birth environment entitle them to.

Shall we, then, with this splendid opportunity before us to bring the health and happiness of our County up to the standard of perfection, shall we, I ask, neglect this great opportunity, in order to provide a palace for three or four indigents? Please do not think that I am desirous that the County shirk any of her responsibilities. On the contrary, the Paupers who DO NOT BELONG TO STATE INSTITUTIONS would be so few in number that they could be cared for at The Hospital with the addition of very, very little expense. Poverty and Pauperism are a disease. Shall we encourage thriftlessness and treat the results of our carelessness in regard to the Public Health; or shall we raise the standards of our physical well being so that we will be able, in a large measure, to prevent vagabondism and vagrancy? This is the question that is before you.

I trust, Gentlemen, that you may not consider me too presumptuous in thus expressing my views. I believe in American Citizenship and I know that you, Gentlemen, desire to do that which is to be for the "greatest good of the greatest number," and whatever your decision in this matter may be I shall remain.

Was an Upright Christian Gentleman That Had the Interest of His Fellowman at Heart... Funeral This Afternoon.

Mr. William M. Lang died at 1:30 o'clock Friday afternoon, at his home in Farmville, after a long illness, having been in poor health several years. He was a son of the late Mr. W. G. Lang, and was 53 years of age. In his death Farmville and Pitt County loses a good and useful citizen. For many years he was one of Farmville's leading merchants, and also engaged largely in farming. He took active part in the progress of his town and county, and used his means liberally to that end.

He was a member of the Christian church and his life was that of an upright man. He was also a Mason and devoted to the principals of the fraternity.

The burial will take place this afternoon at 3 o'clock with Masonic honors.
