

## Wash County Citizens Realize The Real Value of Whole Time Health Officer

Vaccinating over 3,000 people in one county against typhoid in about three months is a fine record. That is just what Dr. H. E. Washburn, whole time county health officer in Wash County, reports. During the month of August he immunized 1,531 people. The people of Wash County as well as their health officer seem to realize more than ever the real value of a health officer in saving lives and preventing sickness. The results of only a few months of this kind of work are beginning to show in the decrease in the typhoid fever rate in Wash County. On August 31, at the height of the typhoid fever season there were only sixteen cases in the entire county. This is said to be much less than usual.

Besides the special work against typhoid, the Wash County Health Officer during the last month vaccinated seventy-eight people against smallpox, examined and treated twelve for hookworm disease, examined four specimens of sputum for tuberculosis, gave eleven lectures on health subjects, besides doing the usual work formerly done by the county physician, namely, visiting the jail and county home and making commitment examination for the State Hospital.

The story of the progress of health work is best told in the closing paragraph of the August report of the Health Officer, where he says "Citizens in all parts of Wash County are becoming interested in public health work, as is shown by the large attendance at the dispensaries. The health officer is constantly called upon to give advice on problems relating to the betterment of sanitary conditions about the homes and places of work, and the demand for literature on health topics is also increasing. These things show that Wash County has developed to the point where the citizens realize the value of health and are ready to co-operate in any endeavor to prevent sickness."

### Serious Shooting in Chicod Township.

Joe Daniels, a colored man living on Mr. Calvin Mills farm in the Black Jack Section of Chicod township was shot Saturday night and is reported to be in a serious condition. Particulars of the affair seem to be about as follows: Joe was not satisfied with one girl, he had to have two, so he proceeded to make love to a couple of dusky maids. He seemed to favor one more than the other causing jealousy between them. The slighted girl waiting her opportunity brought her gun into play and shot at Joe while he was talking to the other girl. The ball took effect in his stomach and was taken out later by Dr. Laughlinhouse. It had passed almost through his body and was removed from his back. It is said he has slight chances of recovery.

### Fatal Auto Accident.

Craig of Statesville, and W. H. McCabe, Jr., of Charlotte, were seriously injured in an automobile accident at Crofts, a small station near Charlotte about 11 o'clock last night.

Mr. John Craig, Mr. McCabe, and Miss Maxwell motored to Statesville yesterday afternoon, and after taking supper with Mr. D. J. Craig, started in company with the latter on the return trip to Charlotte.

It cannot be learned at this hour just how the accident occurred, but it is known that the machine crashed into a telephone pole, pinning the occupants under it with the above fatal results.

### May Build Homes for Aged Members

Indianapolis, Ind., Sept. 21—The eighteenth annual convention of the United Carpenters and Joiners' Association of America assembled in this city and will remain in session ten days at two weeks. Nearly 500 delegates, representing local branches of the organization throughout the United States and Canada, were on hand when the gathering was called to order this morning by James Kirby, the general president of the organization. The initial session was devoted to the opening addresses and the work of organization. It is expected the preliminary business will occupy the time until Wednesday, after which the convention will take up its real work the question of building two homes for aged members of the organization is one of the important matters that will come before the convention for consideration and action.

### Winston-Salem Wins

Winston-Salem, champions of the Carolina League, took the interstate title by defeating Norfolk Saturday, at the first game of a scheduled double-header. The score stood 2 to 1 in favor of Norfolk until the ninth inning when Winston made a rally and at the end of this inning the score was 4 to 2 in favor of Winston.

### Bank Fails at Merry Oaks

Raleigh, Sept. 21—The corporation commission has closed the bank at Merry Oaks, Chatham County, because of excessive over drafts being permitted. It is said the cashier, W. L. Norris, permitted C. W. Weir a lumberman, to overdraw to the sum of nearly seven thousand dollars, which is equal to the capital stock and surplus together. The deposits with the assets are given at \$26,000, the liabilities total \$46,000. The failure is said to be due solely to local mismanagement. Earl B. Franklin is president.
