

TO PRESENT Estimate Savs That Much Tobacco Already Sold Here.

According to the monthly report of Supervisor Wharton, of the local tobacco market Greenville has sold during the month of November 3.685,680 14.73 per hundred pounds.

This totals for the season up to the first of December about seventeen million pounds, making an average in price of nearly 13 cents, for all tobac cos including the common and good. There Are Just Four Excuses Which Will Be Taken By The Teachers-Constables Will Aid in Enforcement

> "3rd. Inability to buy the necessary books and clothes. Note, however, this effect, and that this excuse does shall have been furnished in any way.

Extreme poverty, making the child's labor absolutely necessary for his own support, or for the support of his family. The teacher may grant excuses for temporary absence because of unusual storm or bad weather, sickness or death in the child's family, and unforeseen or unavoidable accidents.

"The township constables have been asked to serve as attendance officers. and the teachers are required to notify them of the unexcused absence of any child coming within the operations of this law. A careful and conscientious effort vill be made this year to enlists published during November total 232 officers, 45.184 non-commissioned the hearty cooperation of every parent officers and men in all fields of war in the county in our efforts to get any one, and it will not do this. Certainly, children between the ages of eight and twelve should be in school for at least four mouths in each year. to this requirement.

"We are hoping that the parents will see that there children are in school, so that we shall not have to call upon' the law to enforce attendance.
