Just now our eyes turn to Alabama. Alabamians are a brave and patriotic people. How they ne to be involved in a condition that nearly approaches and may become revolution is generally known, but a review of the aituation by this writer may be pardoned a generous public.

re are three men in Alabama and whom the present storm tere. They are Thomas (2. William O. Oates and Roben F. Kolb.

Thomas G. Jones, entered the military service of the Confederate ates when a mere boy, and rved through the war with istinguished gallantry on the staff Gen. John B. Gordon, After e war he read law and soon beame distinguished at the bar. In 1892 he was the Democratic ndidate for Governor and was ected ever Reuben F. Kolb. He is ill Governor, and will hold the ofuntil the inauguration of his coessor, on the 1st of December. William C. Oates is what is plarly termed a self-made man. Without any of the advantages of early education he has made his way in life by indomitable energy and native talent of a very high order. He has always been noted or personal bravery and dauntices moition. During the war he lost his right arm in battle and rose

to the rank of Colonel. After the ar he became a lawyer, rose to

eminence in his profession, and has

for many years represented his

district in Congress. At the election last August he was elected Governor of Alabama, defeating Capt. Kelb. Reuben F. Kolb belongs to one of the most distinguished families in the State. His mother was Smily Shorter, a daughter of Gen. Reuben C. Shorter, and the sister of Gov. John Gill Shorter, Congreseman Eli S. Shorter and Railread Commissioner Henry R. Shorter. He was educated at Chapel Hill, and Howard College, and soon after his graduation married Miss Callie Cargile, one of the most beautiful and accomplished women in the State. He organised Kolb's battery of Light Artillery, a splendid Company, which be commanded with distinguished gallantry throughout the war. The inheritor of wealth, he was for a time a large cotton planter, then an enthusiastic advocate of intensive forming, about which time he originated the Kolb Gem watermelon. Subsequently he became Commissioner of Agriculture, and it is claimed by his friends that the dispute with Governor Jones over the commissionership sed him to antagonize the niar Democracy of Alabama.


