The first observance of a day of thankagiving, formally recommended by the civil anthorities, occurred in Leyden, Holland, October 3, 1575, it being the first anniversary of the deliverance of the d in city from siege. In July, 1623, a day of fasting

Charlestown records show a like change of last day into antegiving in 1631, on account of the arrivel of supplies from Ire-

Dr. Franklin tells us that in a ima of great despondency among the settlers of New England it was proposed in one of their public meetings to prodain a fast. An aged farmer rose and spoke of their provoking heaven with their com-plaints, and of the cause they had for thanksgiving. He then made a motion that instead of appointing a day of fasting, they should appoint a day of thanksgiving. The assembly readily agreed.

Massachusetts Bay was the first of the colonies to appoint a day.

Massachusetts Bay was the first of the colonies to appoint an annual thanksgiving by the proclamation of the English governor. During the revolution Thanksgiving day was a national institution, being annually recommended by contrast, out after the general Thanksgiving for peace in 1384 there was no national appointment until 1789, when Washington, by request of congress, recommended a day of Thanksgiving for the acceptant of the constitution. 
