The Election Law provides (Section 9) that whenever a Precinct, as laid off by the Clerk, shall not be identical in boundries with any existing Precinct at the election of 1894, then there shall be in such Precinct a new Registration. It is further provided that where the Registration Book shall be mutilated or lost in any Precinct that there shall be a new Registration in

Therefore if in the following Precincts in which the boundries have not been changed the Registration book is lost or so mutilated as to render the names uniatelligable, then and in that case Registrars are directed to cause a new registration of the qualified voters of the Precinct to wit; Truetts, Lee's Farm.

In each and every Precinct where new registration is had each qualified voter offering to register must take the oath prescribed by law be-






