**Chairman Manly and Holton Each Give Figures on North Carolina.**

RALEIGH, N. C., November 4.—In a bulletin, at noon; Chairman Manly says, "Returns indicate Democratic gains in every county save two. So far as heard from, the gains, which if maintained are pure to give Watson a safe majority. I think it safe to say he is elected." Bryan's majority will not be less than twenty thousand.  
I think Kitchener and Doughton are elected. The Republican Chairman is placing his returns on the vote of 1892. When we had forty thousand plurality.  
Chairman Holton says Settle's election is not certain. Thinks Linney is elected. Pearson telegraphed he is safe. I have no figures on Watson and Russell.  
McKinley carries the State if ratio given in reports from 21 counties keep up. In these the gain is 20,000, on the vote of 1892."

KINGSTON, N. C., November 4.—W. T. McCarthy, Republican elect for State Senate has majority in Greene county of 300, and in Lenoir county, of 300.

BNAUFORT, N. C., November 3.—D. L. Ward and E. M. Koonce, Democrats carried Carteret county by 77 majority, E. C. Duncan, Republican State legislative elected by 37.

**SULTAN MUST ACT.**  
Statement About Armenia Before French Deputies. Demand Made For Security.  
PARIS.—In the Chamber of Deputies the minister of foreign affairs, M. Hanotaux made an important statement regarding Armenia, in the course of which he said:  
"The powers have done their duty and accord has been established between the powers who recognized that isolated action must be averted and that common action would not effect the integrity of Turkey. During the Czar's visit a precise exchange of views occurred on the points before Parliament. United Europe will be able to show the Sultan that he must give his subjects security and peace."  
"United Europe will make the Sultan understand that not only the Armenians but the Catholics and the Mussulmans are suffering from the same evils and need the same ameliorations, and will show him that the source of those evils is a bad internal administration. It will indicate the means to establish order everywhere, without which the country cannot continue to exist. It will demand the execution of his promises and the enforcement and extension of the reforms already granted, will put an end to violent repression, will open the prisons, and will also bring home to him that the powers hold him responsible for the safety of Europeans."

M. Jaures, the radical socialist deputy for Carmaux, attacked the government for shirking its duty, and denounced the covetous policy of England and Russia. He then submitted a motion blaming the government, which was rejected by a vote of 481 days to 34 years.  
Then the order of the day was adopted by a vote of 403 to 90, thus approving the government's statement.  
Afterward the Chamber of Deputies voted a million francs for the relief of the sufferers by floods.

**THE COTTON MARKETS.**

The Liverpool news shows an advance of 3-32 in spot cotton and the sales were 28,099 bales, the largest for any one day in several months.  
New York opened at 8.24 for January with the one firm.

**Cost Saved His Life.**

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J.—John Krause and Joseph Daniel were lodged in jail charged with atrocious assault and battery with intent to kill upon John Terhune, cashier of the First National Bank of Long Branch. The cashier was shot by one of the two men whom he caught poaching. His thick overcoat saved him from serious injury. The cashier has been annoyed a great deal by depredations of gunners, who shoot rabbits in open defiance of the law which says that the animals must not be killed until November 10th.

Mr. Terhune has done much towards securing the enforcement of game laws in this section. He went for a stroll with James Reed, a farmer. Hearing shots they concluded that poachers were at work and trespassing on Reed's property. Soon they came upon two men with guns. Terhune reminded them that they were shooting on Sunday and out of season, and he considered it his duty to turn them over to the law.  
One of the gunners swore, and the other said, "If you don't mind your own business we will find a way to make you," and he pointed his gun at Reed and took aim.  
Being unarmed, Reed took to his heels. The gunner pulled the trigger, but the cap did not explode. Then the other poacher fired at Terhune; the latter felt something strike him and thought that he was badly injured, but was able to run. Afterward he found that none of the shot had penetrated his overcoat. Reed and Terhune then returned to the village and alarmed the farmers.

The poachers were found at Browtown four miles away. Constable Connors arrested them. They did not have their guns with them, but Reed and Terhune were positive that they were the right men. They refused to talk.

**China's Award to America.**
