LATEST CABINET.

SEN. ALLISON PROMINENT FOR SECRETARY STATE-

A Man Capable for Position. Senato Quay Named, Partile Coast to be Recognised. Gold Democrats Chances.

WASHINGTON, D. C., November 11-The up to date Cabinet state now contains the name of Senator Allison as premier of the new administration.

Senator Allison fills all the require ments. He has been a possible Presiden tial candidate. He has a wide experience He is from the middle West, the great battle ground of the campaign, and he is a warm personal friend of the President

Besides these qualifications the Senato possesses an ample fortune and can holo seventy years old, and four years as Secretary of State would be a fitting close to his long and honorable career. He would favor an aggressive toreign policy, and would do more to push international bimetallism than most any other Republicar

The same slate contains the name of Senator Quay for one of the portifolios. The Senator is known to be enamored of the Navy Department, and would like b retire from political life after a term there. But it is thought his great executive abili ty would show to better advantage at the head of the Postoffice Department. B. that as it may, it looks as if the Senator could have either partfolio if he so de-

The guessers have come down to the fact that the Secretaryship of the Treas ury is to go to New York. Cornelius N. Bliss is to be the man. Mr. Platt wil. come back to the Senate if he chooses; i not, he will send one of his lieutenants.

From Wisconsin will come either Mr. Beboock or Mr. Payne. The latter gen tlemen seems to have the call, if he wants anything. His work during the campaign deserves recognition, but his bealth and his business may require him to decline any offers. In such an event Mr. Babgock would be first choice for either the Interior or the Postoffice Department.

For Attorney General it is though Major McKinley will go to his own State. Hon R. W. Taylor, now representing Major McKinley's old district, is said to be the man for the place. He is a good lawyer, and the portfolio would lose no dignity while in his hands,

The Pacific Coast is to be recognized in this official household. It is thought that Representative Hermann of Oregon, will finally be decided upon. He lost his chance of returning to Congress by rerefused to go to his State thinking his place was here. His long service on the Rivers and Harbors committee we uld t him for the Navy Department.

The gold Democrats are to be put in line if the new administration can do it. All recognize the service done during the sight miles from Yuma, Cal., in which he campaign, but it is not thought that any of them will be invited into the Cabinet On some of the planks of the Chicago platform there is an irreconcilable difference and this would make it unpleasant.

Two of the most important foreign embearies, it is thought, would be the very thing for them, Gen. Buckner may be invited to go abroad. The only objection ald be his age. Senator Palmer is too old. He will retire from political life after March 4. So these plums may go to some of the younger and more active men of the National Democratic party.

A number of the lesser lights will be taken care of by judicial and other ap pointments. Mr. Bynum it is said, would be glad to be appointed to the vacancy in the U. S. Court of Claims, caused by the death of Judge Richardson. If he does not secure this Mojor McKinley, it is ed, will find some judgeship equally to his liking.
