### IF NOT IMPEACHED

**Judge Forwood Will Keep Sober For Six Years.**

Judge Bryan to Hold Norwood's Court. Division of Spoils Causes Stir. Major Guthrie Will Not Assail.

RALEIGH, N. C., February 2.—Judge Norwood is here and tomorrow he will go before the House Judiciary committee, and he says that he will pledge himself to remain sober six years, if he is not impeached.

Gov. Russell is asked to have Judge Henry R. Bryan hold Judge Norwood's court in Union county.

There is a great stir about the division of offices.

Robert Reinhardt, it is declared by the Populists, must have the penitentiary management, as he delivered the votes of the members to Senator Fritchard, and the latter promised him this place.

The North Carolina railway directors met here today. Out of 459 private stock holders, only 38 live outside of the State.

Maj. W. A. Guthrie told the quarrelling Populists today: "You have kindled this fire and you must not expect me to pour any water on it."

**Tried to Blow Up Train.**  
KINROSS, Jamaica.—Two attempts were made on Saturday to blow up a train on the Jamaica Railroad.

After one explosion, causing only slight damage, a search was made along the line, which resulted in the discovery near the rails of a large canister of explosives.

The trouble seems to have arisen from the discharge of some of the employes of the railroad. Anonymous threats have reached the newspapers recently, intimating that something serious would happen unless leading officials of the road were dismissed.

NEW YORK.

DEAR SIR:—The main features in the cotton market continue unchanged. We have had a week of moderate receipts without imparting any activity or securing improvement in values. Notwithstanding the general reports received from the South, that there is less cotton marketed, than at some time last season, we continue each week to run ahead of last season's movement. The liberal volume this week was somewhat surprising in view of the cold and stormy weather reported from the South.

We think the trade at large are expecting \$4 millions and that receipts will cease to be an important factor as long as they indicate about this quantity. Trade conditions and new crop outlook will be subjects of far greater importance in the future. The present effort among Eastern spinners to devise means, probably by curtailment, to find relief from burdensome stock involves one of the most serious problems the mills have to confront. If our crop is \$4 million bales and the consumption no larger, the market will be ruled by next crop's prospects altogether. The exports are the one distinguishing feature in favor of the market. But we must not forget that stocks abroad are increasing and are now quite liberal. Prices are four to eleven points lower on next crop and fourteen to eighteen on next crop than a week ago.

Disorders in Crete.

LONDON.—A dispatch to the Times from Athens confirms the reports of the conflicts between Christians and Mohammedans in the Heraklion district of the island of Crete as cabled to the Associated Press Sunday night.

Additional advices received by the Times are to the effect that the village of Galata has been burned and that several inhabitants have been killed. Both sides, Christians as well as Mohammedans, appear to have suffered from these recent disorders.

Among those known to have been murdered during the outbreaks is Marchookis Pasha, a Cretan judge.

Reports indicate that the Turkish troops are behaving unusually well. Up to the present time no news has been received of their taking part in any of the Cretan disorders.

Armed bands of Mussulmans still continue to roam over the island, however, and the Christians have occupied and fortified the important places from a strategic and military view point for the purpose of preventing the attacks of the Mohammedans.

### THE STATE CAPITAL.

#### The Division of State Spoils Discussed.

Applicants for Law Licenses. Warning Against Fertilizers. Skinner the Populist Leader. Negroes as Assistant Clerks.

RALEIGH, N. C., February 2.

The Republicans and the bolting Populists held a conference last night and attempted to dish out pie to their respective parties. The Republicans were to take the penitentiary, railway commission, Morganton Insane Asylum, Blind Asylum (Morganton), Deaf and Dumb Institute (Morganton), A. & N. C. R. R. to the Populists, Agricultural Department, Labor Bureau, Fish Commission, A. & M. College, Judge Eastern district (Orninal), Raleigh Insane Asylum and the Goldboro Insane Asylum. All these calculations may be upset but anyhow it gives them something to talk about.

In the Supreme court yesterday there were forty applicants for license to practice law. Three failed. Lou J. Leary was the only applicant from Craven.

The directors of the N. C. R. R. met here at the Park Hotel today. It was the regular meeting for the transaction of routine business, but of course the lease was discussed. This morning's paper here is full of venom against H. W. Miller, and Col. A. B. Andrews, private directors.

There are 498 brands of fertilizers for sale in this State and 98 of these only are made in the State. Some have not registered and the Agricultural Department are asking farmers to warn them if any such are offered to them.

Congressman Skinner is here. Late last night he issued a 4000 word address. He will be designated as the Populist leader in this State.

Mr. A. J. Cook and not Mr. Scoville will be the manager of the Yarbors. Mr. Cook is too well known to need any word of introduction as a hotelier.

Mr. Hardison introduced a bill to carry into effect the educational provisions of the constitution. Having 4 months schools, having commissioners to levy taxes sufficient to carry it out, also compulsory education between 8 and 16 years, probate fee 10c, and registration fee 30c to apply to certain counties west, passed third reading.

There was quite a debate about the dividing out of the colonial records and it was referred to the committee, some wanted them sold and others distributed free of costs to schools.

Really during the month that the legislature has been in session not a bill of any special importance has been passed.

Mr. Swinson the enrolling clerk is out in a letter giving his reasons for refusing to accept the negroes as assistants. He says his position makes him responsible for his office work. He has an equal number of Republican and Populist clerks and if the negroes are appointed it must be done by special act of General Assembly relieving him of all responsibility. He is rather upset on the question and has his dander up.
