STEEL RAIL RUPTURE.


ne of the Firms Couldn't Resist Big Contract. New Yors,-The Even ng Post print the following:

An interesting account of the direc auses which precipitated the rupture in he Steel Rail Pool, announced at Pittsourg was given by a person familiar with he situation. Representatives of two of he largest mills met in Chicago on Mon iny to agree upon rates governing busi iess in a particular section of the coun ry, and decided upon \$20 as a basis pricor certain transactions. Just at th ime some large contracts came into the narket, and one of the concerns interes al was offered profitable business at ower figure. Rumors of cutting in var ous directions were current at the time s) the tempting offer was accepted, and in order aggregating many thousands or one was taken at a price said to be he neighborhood of \$17 a ton. This recessitated, of course, the withdrawn f one concern from the pool, and hos ilities were at once begun as soon as the ranshetions became generally known. Orders were taken in this city at effice price of \$20 for rails at the mill

and local agents of some of the largest oncerns are said to be anxious to do to nuch business as possible while an oper narket prevails. It is not possible at this time to tell ast what effect prevailing prices wil ave upon outstanding contracts. With

a the last few weeks contracts amounag to more than \$1,000,000 have been ande by some of the railways at priceiveraging \$23 or \$27 a ton, and although ome of them are binding at those fig tres, it is though likely that many or loes will be delivered at a lower rate by aills anxious to hold the patronage good customers. Whatevor settlement s reached, however, losses are inevitable The present situalion, it is thought vill not disturb immediately the marke or street car rails, and the large contractecently given by local companies ar ot likely to be affected.




