THE STATE CAPITAL.

The Republicans do not want Free Silver. Enrolling Clerk Swinson Ousted Because he Refuses to Appoint Negro Assistants. The Vance Yonument.

JOURNAL BUREAU, RALEIGH, N. C., February 13, '97. The Republicans do not really want to pass any of the anti-free pass bills or free silver resolutions. They laughed in the House yesterday while a Populist who was moving to table a lot of bills unfavorably reported including an anti-pass bill in the list and then moved to table a sensible resolution in regard to forbidding any giving of notes, etc., payable in gold.

Some of the Democrats are trying to fight the combined forces of the Republicans and Populists bolters. Really it seems a waste of breath. There are 171 members of the legislature and no less than 83 are in this machine. Of course it goes over everything rough shod. The preceding officers snub Democrats daily.

There is an immense desire on the part of the Republicans to placate the negro at last conscious of his power, and a trifle nurally since the session began. The negro has been more in evidence than ever before. He demands the superintendency of the Goldsboro Asylum (and gets it), the position of physician at the deaf-mute and blind institution (colored here, and also demands a part of the officers at the penitentiary. The negro endorses the reformatory bill and wants \$50,000 for a normal training school, annually. The negro is particular to say that he cast 123,000 votes in North Carolina, while the white Republicans cast 35,000.

The enrolling clerk of the legislature, A. L. Swinson, who was kicked out because of his refusal to appoint negro clerks, is yet no officer according to the express declaration of his attorney, W. J. Douglas. The latter said this evening: "I can prove 100 affidavits that the purpose of the bill passed by the legislature was simply to oust Swinson and I can also show by our State law that no law can pass by a legislature abolishing an office after it has elected a person to fill it. Besides there is no one for Swinson to turn the property over to, so the legal measure. The forcing of the door at his office and the breaking of locks on his desks is a high-handed outrage."

Osner J. Spears is a candidate for U. S. district attorney of this district. It is asserted here that J. B. Hill will get again as U. S. Marshal. Delegations officially representing a number of points along the line of the North Carolina railway will arrive here Monday in order to work against an report of the lease of that road. The debate on the bill in the house Tuesday will be the most notable of the session and will attract a great audience.

News from the Morganton hospital is that Rev. Dr. Marshall of this city who is under a special course of treatment, is rapidly improving. Judge Robinson of the Superior court was here today to hear arguments in the motion to appoint a receiver for the Raleigh Paper company.

Senator Butler addressed the Populist caucus last night. He says no more of the regular Populists have jumped the fence and joined the bolters save the three already named, so the strength of the bolting element is now twenty-two.

It is said that Gov. Russell particularly desires that D. B. Sutton shall be mayor of Wilmington and has so informed the latter.

C. T. Bailey, of this city, and S. W. Hancock of New Berne, are appointed assistant adjutants-general, with rank of major.

The bills in the House Friday were to reduce the salaries and fees of all public officers, save those fixed by law 25 per cent. A committee was appointed to be composed of Governor Russell, Julian S. Carr and W. A. Hoke, looking to the monument to be raised here in honor of Z. B. Vance. This committee reports to the next legislature and \$1,000 to be appropriated for all necessary expenses. The House took up the report of insane asylums and their maintenance. There are 26 criminal insane at Morganton. It is recommended that a building for this class be provided at the penitentiary, Durham and Robeson counties, be transferred to the Raleigh Asylum. The following appropriations for the three are recommended: For Morganton \$100,000. For Raleigh \$87,550. For Goldsboro \$40,850. This is for maintenance and improvements.

The bill covering these recommendations passed: Resolutions was introduced instructing members of Congress to try and repeal civil service law. The bill let the county commissioners elect the county physician and fix his salary, passed after a hot debate.

In the Senate the Winston-Salem, Southbound R. R., was incorporated. This is a continuation of the Norfolk and Western. To so amend law that railroads, steamboats, etc., give transportation to members and clerks of R. R. commission who are attending to commission business.

Enrolling Clerk Swinson locked up his office, desk, etc. yesterday and did not come up there, so his locks were forced. Later he appeared and upon his keys being demanded of him he produced the following: I respectfully decline to surrender the pillow of enrolling clerk of the General Assembly to which I have been elected, duly sworn and inducted into, and have a vested right to, on the ground that no legislature body has the right to abolish an office for the sole purpose of ousting an incumbent. In the second place, I respectfully decline to surrender

or turn over the papers and records of said office as there is and can be no successor during my continuance in office, and no one who is legally authorized to give me a valid receipt for such records and papers. The matter is to be brought before the Supreme court.

OYSTER BILL PASSED.

Old Laws Revised and Amendments Incorporated.

A. & M. College to be Disassociated from Agricultural Department. New Berne Tobacco Warehouse Chartered.

RALEIGH, N. C., February 13.—The House today passed a bill revising the oyster laws of the State of North Carolina. It is very important and some amendments are incorporated. It is a compromise measure. The bill increases the area in which oysters may be dredged, so as to cover all the waters over ten feet deep. It increases the size of vessels from twenty-five tons to thirty. It imposes a tax of two cents per bushel on oysters, but allows rebate of one cent in each bushel for canning in this State. It imposes tax of twenty-five cents of each man taking oysters with tongs. The tax being 23 per cent on all vessels dredging.

Bay liver in Pamlico county and all Carteret county being exempt from the provisions of the act. While at the capital today ex-Governor Sherman, of Iowa, had an epileptic fit. Two medical members of the legislature attended him.

Up to the end of today's session 98 bills have been introduced in the House. All the desks in the enrolling clerk's office were forced this morning. He will bring suit. James M. Newbourn is slated to be Commissioner of Agriculture, and J. Y. Hamrick Commissioner of Labor Statistics.

The Agricultural College is to be entirely disassociated from the Agricultural Department, and will have a separate board.

The New Berne Tobacco Warehouse Co., was chartered today by the Senate.

Governor Russell expects seventeen Republicans to vote for the bill annulling the lease of the North Carolina Railway.

GOV. RUSSELL CANNOT ATTEND

Pressure of Business Demands His Presence in Raleigh.

RALEIGH, N. C., February 13.—Editor Stevens called on Governor Russell this afternoon to ascertain whether he could attend the New Berne Fair. Governor Russell said it was impossible to visit New Berne, owing to the pressure of business of the State.

THE COTTON MARKETS.

February 13. News from Liverpool was very discouraging and showed further declines of 2-54 on futures and 1-16 on spots. New York has been weak all day and the close 6.78 for May delivery, a net loss 12-107 since Thursday. It is evident that there is a great deal of distressed cotton on the market. As soon as this cotton has passed into other and stronger hands the pressure will be relieved and a reaction should be in order.
