WASHINGTON NEWS.

Inauguration the Sole Popic Of

Greatest Sight in Display Ever Wit nessed. Large Amount Money Contributed, Large Parade. Railroad Traffic. JOURNAL BUREAU.

WARHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 17. The main topics of conversation this town these days are the inaugura ion, and the chances of having pleasan veather on the 4th of March. If this i not the greatest show inauguration this country has ever seen, it will be because hose who constitute the committee i charge of the affair are incompetent and not because they haven't money enough More money has been raised for this in auguration than for any other, and more aid has been received from the Govern nent than was ever given any other in or the non-partisanship of Congressmen when a Democratic administration avish in its appropriations and favors to he committee in charge of the inaugura ion of a President of opposite politica

Sixty thousand dollars was raised 1 hose in charge, and this helped out by Jovernment aid has enabled the comnittee to arrange most claborate and exensive schemes for decorations, illumiantions, fire-works and every possible kind of display. There will be the greatst display of flags ever seen in this city. Congress has passed a resolution directing the Secretaries of War and Navy to oan to the inauguration committee, all he flags and emblems which these two lepartments have in their possession for lecorating for the inaugural ceremonies. and these together with the 50,000 flage urchased by the committee for distrib ion along the line of parade will made remendous display of bunting.

All the public building are to be builtantly illuminated by electric lights, and rom the roofs of near-by buildings search ights will throw their powerful rays pon them. During the grand army en ampment in 1893 powerful search lights vere located on the roof of a tall building early a mile from the capital and thei eavs concentrated on first the capita and then the tall shaft of the Washing ton monument and the effect was most cautiful and was one of the features of he illumination at that time. It is now coposed to carry this scheme out on a arger scale so that all the great white public buildings may be made to stance out in the darkness in magnified glory fue firework display is to be the greatest ever had here and is to be the most

The parade which is to pass in review sefore President McKinley is to be the reatest in point of military display ever ad at any inauguration. General Hor see Porter has adopted a schedule which will enable 12,000 an hour to pass before the reviewing stand. Military and civil organizations are to march 24 abreast and are to march in close order. General Porter's experience in handling the nonster McKinley parade in New Yort will enable him to properly handle the 50,000 men expected in line on the 4tl

of March. One of the unique features of the parate will be the presence of 150 Indians from the several tribes in then own distictive dress, with all the paint and feathers and ornaments they are vont to wear on extraordinary occasions. These are to be followed by the Indian tudents from the school at Hampton It is designed in this way to show the great progress made by the young men at the Carlisle schools.

Another interesting feature of the parade will be the blue jackets from the ressels of the White Squadron. Many of these vessels will not be able to reach Washington because of the shallowness of the Potomac river, but they will send heir men up to the city on smaller boats It is a shame that Congress does not pro vide sufficient funds to keep the river open so that one or more of our best saips could be at the city during an even of this kind when there are so many visi tors from the interior who would like to get a sight of one of these \$4,000,000 seanties for which they help to pay.

Civil organizations must number a ast 50 in order to secure a stated place o the parade. It is expected that at east 15,000 members of the Republican eague clubs will be in line.


