JOURNAL BUREAU. WASHINGTON, D. C. Feb., 23, 1897. With all its boasted dignity and deliberation the Senate is not above a bit of lap trap now and then. In view of its studied ignoring of the inhuman outrages in Cuba, right at our doors, so to speak. its latest effort in this line, the adoption of a resolution expressing sympathy with Preece for its stand in behalf of liberty in far away Crete-was about its worst As long as nothing is to be done for the cause of liberty in Cuba, it would seem

to be good taste to say nothing about

liberty elsewhere. The House Committee on Coinage has avorably reported the Senate interna ional monetary conference bill, but i as added amendments which may caus the bill to fail, not because of opposition out for the lack of time. It is the opin ion of nearly everybody that there is only a meagre chance for any legislation staer than that which can be put or some appropriation bill as an amendnent to get acted upon in the short ime remaining of the session. There i nuch work yet to be done on several o he appropriation bills, and a disposi ion, especially in the House, to wrangle ver small items.

An amendment offered to the sundry ivil appropriation bill in the Senate, may save a far-reaching effect upon the Fed ral office-holders, if it should be adoptd. It authorizes the President to exrated since the passage of the Civil Ser rice Act, and to revise, modify, or enarge them in accordance with the condiions of good administration and th rue purpose of the act. There is no loubt about the meaning of this amend nent. It is intended to open the way or the appointment of a larger numbe of men in political sympathy with thncoming administration. There are lowever, a number of Republicans who egret that this amendment has been rought forward.
