WILL DEFEAT BILL
Changing Charter City of New Berne.
So Says Judge Ewart. Important Bills Passed. Educational Bill. N. C. R. R. Lease Bill Substitute Favorably Reported.
Special.
RALEIGH, N. C., February 25.—The following bills passed the House: To charter the Winston-Salem Southbound railway, the State to furnish surveyors and convicts and receive the road's bonds in payment for the convict labor.
To appropriate \$5,000 additional to the University and \$12,500 additional to State Normal and Industrial school.
The Governor is urging that Sutton of Cumberland to become a railway commissioner in lieu of Judge of the Eastern terminal circuit.
The members of the Assembly who went to New Berne are singing the praises of that city and the Fair.
The majority Populist caucus on Monday, Russell had a conference tonight at his request, regarding the release bill.
The committee on education reported favorably by a unanimous vote the bill to give the colored normal schools \$1,000 more, and the bill to appropriate from the Treasury \$100,000 to public schools in those townships which by taxation raise an amount equal to that which the State allows. There is \$165,000 of educational fund on hand.
Judge Ewart says that the New Berne charter bill will be defeated in the Senate but lots of House members would not vote for it had they not known it would be defeated in the Senate.
The Special Senate Committee this evening unanimously signed a report regarding the action of the directors of the North Carolina Railway in leasing it to the Southern Railway, setting forth that nothing at all improper was done.
The Committee also decided to favorably report Senator Grant's substitute case bill.

The Great Prize Fight.
DANIEL McFARREY'S VIEW.
Daniel McFarrey, now in Omaha Neb., thinks Fitzsimmons will win the fight. He says a great boxer will meet Fitz in the fight, and that in such cases the fighter usually carries the money home. After giving Cullitt credit for money earned, both in sparring and in sound boxing with the finest amateurs, he adds that there is no man living that Fitz cannot hit. Then he says that Corbett has never yet been hit in a battle, but when he does get hurt he will forget his cleverness.
SOME NEW YORK BETS.
The following bets have been made in New York: Ed. Kerney, Jr., \$2,000 to 1,000 with "Dick" Roche, that Corbett will win; Chas. Thorley, \$500 to \$400 for Corbett; Dr. Ramon S. Gutierrez, \$400 to \$300 on Fitzsimmons; "Honest" John Kelley, \$500 to \$400, with Dick Roche or Corbett; Al. H. Sheldon, \$500 even for Corbett; Samuel Fitzpatrick, \$300 to 1,000, with Joseph Little, on Corbett.
PUSS MAY BE ATTACHED.
The New York Journal announced that Al. Smith, the stakeholder of the fight, has received Dan Stuart's final \$10,000 of the stake, but that he will not admit it for fear Vendig, who claims to be Stuart's partner, will attack the purse.

Telegraphic Items.
The suspension has been announced in the New York stock exchange of William A. Alley, a member of the exchange since 1878.
Leading French-Canadians, of Woonsocket, R. I., and other sections of Southern New England, have started a movement to establish a French-Canadian college.
At a mass-meeting of the unemployed in St. Paul, a protest was made against the distribution of city relief funds by the Charity Organization society.
Fire broke out in the Merchants' exchange building and destroyed all the offices on the top floor. The loss is \$80,000. Firemen were hampered by overhead wires.
Crossman Brothers, of Rochester, N. Y., seedsmen, filed a general assignment for the benefit of their creditors. The liabilities are estimated at \$50,000. The firm will resume business.
The corner-stone of the new school for the revival of the lost mysteries of antiquity was laid at Point Loma, Cal., Mrs. Katherine Tingley and E. T. Hargrave, of the Theosophical society officiating.

The Ringland house, Oswego, N. Y., and six adjoining smaller buildings were destroyed by fire. There were thirty guests in the hotel at the time, who were rescued by the police and firemen. The loss will amount to \$75,000.
Gov. Bradley has ordered Col. Gaither with a detachment of the State Guards to protect George Deeming, who is to be tried at Franklin, Ky., March 1, on a charge of murdering Charles Coon, a prominent farmer of that place. Deeming is now in jail at Louisville for safe-keeping.

THE STATE CAPITAL.
Hates Exerted for New Berne Fair Bills Passed. Negroes Demand "P.C." Populist Divided. New Items.
JOURNAL RECORD, RALEIGH, N. C., February 25.
Yesterday there was such a slight advance in the legislative halls on account of so many going to the New Berne Fair that very little business was done.
In the House bills introduced were to reduce portion of legislators to \$7,000 a year, a tremendous price for such work as they have to do, (this winter) to make \$1,000 additional appropriation to be colored State Normal schools.
Bills were passed: To require public school teachers to read aloud to their pupils twice a year the Constitution of the United States and the State of North Carolina to provide for the inspection of coal mines, and the safety of miners.
The Senate devoted its time to local bills of no special interest.
Yesterday at the house of the bride Miss Maggie Cooper was married to Mr. R. B. Hall, of Atlanta. It was a very quiet marriage on account of the bride being in deep mourning, but the case was beautifully decorated. The bride and her bridesmaids, Miss Mamie Cooper, and Mrs. Attie Gales were dressed in single white dresses.
Personal news Senator, said yesterday that the negroes demanded the colored school at Goldsboro and part of the anti-slavery patronage, and he intended to carry the Legislature into such a position tomorrow will be the North Carolina railroad bill in the Senate. It will be very much amended on the bill the House passed. It did not get Governor Russell has put in the hands of Senator Ashburn a substitute for the original bill which will be introduced. This bill it is said only provides for legislative authority to bring out to test the legality of the lease.
Senator Grant today introduced a bill, part of which touches the lease. Legislative approval of the lease will make the term not to exceed thirty years instead of the ninety-nine years. It is a compromise bill and one that will be readily supported by any members.
The Populist party seems to be hopelessly divided. Many of them vote all ways with the Democrats now.
Yesterday your correspondent went all through the new cream houses and laboratory at the Agricultural and Mechanical college. Tomorrow all stores will be open; where the strawberries were here, my strawberries nearly ready to bloom. Many flowers, ferns and palms are the place attractive. This department cost \$1,000.
