NEW BERNE CHARTER.

Senator McCarthy Said Bill Had to be Amended.

Substitute Prepared Makes It Like Wilmington Bill. Senatorial Bribery Case, "Fillers" Prohibited. Young Keeps His Seat.

RALEIGH, N. C., March 2.—Senator W. F. McCarthy of Craven, said tonight that the New Berne charter bill could not be passed in its present state, and so a substitute had been prepared which is precisely like the Wilmington bill; that is, allowing the Governor to appoint an alderman from each ward.

Senate committee on cities report substitute favorably, having acted on it this evening.

Schulken's special committee to investigate the Senatorial bribery case reported to the House.

Senator Utley testified before the committee that he had heard the Populist leaders in the conference say that 200 officers were to be divided among Senator Pritchard's friends, and that if their fall was discovered they would be ruined.

The House passed the bill prohibiting the use of "fillers," such as loam in any commercial fertilizers sold in this State.

The bill to create a police commission for Charlotte failed to pass by a vote of 47 to 69. The election contest, brought against Young, was settled by the House, Young retaining the seat.

The Wilmington charter bill passed its final reading in the Senate and the bill to give Fayetteville a police commission was tabled.

The Big Fight.

CAUSON CITY, Nev.—Not content with legalizing the contest for the world's pugilistic championship, Assemblyman Jim Dempsey proposes to introduce it all in the Legislature within the next few days asking for an appropriation of \$3,000 for the purpose of having made a gorgeous belt of silver studded with diamonds, to be presented to the winner of the Corbett-Fitzsimmons battle.

The bill is being drawn up, and it provides that the secretary of State shall deliver the belt on the 15th of March, along with a certificate and admittance to the prize. It is intended to have on the belt a reproduction of the official seal of Nevada and the face of the signature of Governor Sells to the approval of the prize.

It is claimed that a majority of its members of the Legislature have signed their willingness to vote for the bill and that Governor Sells has already given his consent to sign the act if it passes. The Governor will not admit his considerations, giving an explanation that he never signs a bill of any kind until he has seen and read it thoroughly and he says he approves the idea of a Nevada championship belt.

Corbett says that the idea that he will weigh in the neighborhood of 180 pound when he enters the ring is erroneous, for a matter of fact he expects to weigh he scales at 165 pounds, which is 15 pounds lighter than the weight at which he fought Peter Jackson.

Fitzsimmons has stated that he intends to reduce to 158 pounds, the outside limit of the middle-weight class, in order to say that a middle-weight fought Corbett concerning this Corbett, says, "Fitzsimmons dropping back into the middle weight class for this occasion looks to me like looking for a soft place to fall. He wants defeat and wants to be prepared to say when the fight is over, 'Oh Corbett only licked a middle-weight. I am still the champion of my class.'"

The Latest Betting.

Wm. A. Brady is figuring on the place of \$20,000 which he has for betting purposes. There is an impression that the best betting will be at the ring side. Five wagers aggregating \$9,500 were made at odds of 100 to 50 on Corbett.

The Corbett men are objecting to laying odds, and while they want to put money on their favorite, they declare that there is no reason for the difference in the price.

In New York Dick Roche announces that he has placed all of the \$40,000 which he was commissioned to bet on Fitzsimmons and that he will invest more until he reaches Carson. Edward Collins bet \$200 on Corbett to \$100 on Fitzsimmons and has \$500 more to place at the same odds.

Jockey Fred Taral stands ready to put \$5,000 on Fitzsimmons if he can get odd of 2 to 1.

William Jay Koerner, who was convicted of the murder of Rosa A. Hagan in New York, was sentenced to be executed during the week of April 19.

Ex-Governor William J. Stone was today appointed receiver of the Mullanphy Savings bank, of St. Louis, Mo., which was closed by the State bank examiner on Saturday. Mr. Stone qualified, giving a bond of \$400,000.

Famine Prevents Marriages.

DELHI, India.—This city, the headquarters of the gold and silver wireworkers, jewelers and embroiderers, is feeling the pinch of famine badly. There are no Hindu marriages and no demand for wedding garments. Even the descendants of the Delhi royal family, who are Government pensioners, are unable to meet the high prices prevailing and are receiving private charity. Numerous other respectable classes, too poor to go to work, are enduring the direct poverty.

Sisal is the worst afflicted district of the Southern Punjab.

The mortality among the cattle is enormous. Forty thousand, or 50 per cent. of the total, have died. The starving Mohammedans are killing the cattle, and this causes friction with the Hindus.

The rates on mortgages on land have risen immensely and the land is going into the hands of the usurers.

THE STATE CAPITAL.

Number of Legislative Doings of Interest, Russell's Actions Not Liked. All Parties Cautioning.

JOURNAL RECORD.

RALEIGH, N. C., March 2.

There was a perfect rash of bills in the Legislature yesterday. In the House a bill to amend the Constitution naming 5,000 to be the lowest number of yeas to entitle a party to reorganization and providing for five commissioners to election. The bill passed to incorporate the Winston-Salem Southbound railroad but was reconsidered as it was feared convict labor was to be used and the State to take bonds in the payment of such labor.

The substitute bill passed in the Senate last week regarding the North Carolina railroad lease came up in the House last night. There was of course a wrangle, and finally the bill was referred to the lease committee. It was said that probably the bill would not be reported at all before the close of the session. It is said now that Russell desires the case question to be left unsettled so as to be a campaign matter in 1898.

Many Republicans are kicking against Russell's Czar-like actions. There are many Republicans who refuse to go into his office at all.

Cautioning is going on all the time, in the Democratic party, the Republican and holding Populists, and the latter especially.

The bill to repeal the \$10 tax on doctors and lawyers was not passed. The different sections of the Machinery bill were discussed. A bill appointing a committee with the Governor chairman, to authorize the Agricultural board to make an exhibit at Nashville, Tenn., to be paid for from general fund in Treasury was discussed.

VOLCANO IN SALT LAKE.

Water in Its Vicinity Boils and Spray is Thrown Upon the Air for Hundreds of Feet.

SALT LAKE, Utah.—What appeared to be a genuine volcano has burst forth in the Great Salt Lake a short distance southwest of Promontory Station, on the Central Pacific Railroad.

The phenomenon first appeared recently in the form of a small cloud hovering over the water about a mile and a quarter from the shore. It gradually increased in dimension, and shot up so high in the air that it is now visible a long distance. The water in the vicinity boils and the spray is thrown upon the air for hundreds of feet.

The volcano is situated in the big arm of the lake, on the West side of a long range of mountains, and is distinctly visible from Brigham City. In the last six months there have been several shocks of earthquake in these regions and it is supposed that the fire and lava which have been confined in subterranean depths have now found an outlet and are spending their force.
