But there is a wide difference in arranging for an inaugur ation and in running an administration An inauguration is a non-partisan laffair in which everybody joins hands to make successful and enjoyable, while an ad ministration always has partisan opposi tion outside its own party, and very often nelde of it too. A noteworthy featur of this inauguration was the fraternizing between the members of the outgoing and of the incoming administration. Th inauguration parade was excellently hand led, and the arrangements for the com fort of the two hundred and fifty thous and spectators were away ahead of any thing in that line before, and the street lecorations were not only more numer ous but much more tasteful.
