
## Southern Cotton Mills.

FALL RIVER, Mass. - The agitation over he proposed reduction in hours of labor or cotton mill employes is strong here at present, both for and against the novement.

A statement by Secretary Howard, of he Spinners Union, that the competition of the Southern manufacturers would tot be increased by the adoption of a shorter working day in this section is net by a declaration by one of the most prominent manufacturers that in spite of the strong efforts made in New Engreduction of stock the curtailed produc ion has been more than made up by the ew mills and increased production of he South. It is pointed out that m about three and half years the mills of Fall River have been closed about six months on an average.

For this sacrifice, it is said, no corresponding benefit has accrued, but Southern competitors have run on full time, and filled up the vacuum which Northern nanufacturers have been trying to reate. Fall River owners state that it an be proven beyond question that Southern mills producing the same falrics as those made in this city are realizng satisfactory profits at present mar ket prices. Their taxes are nominal; fuel, in many cases, is less than its cost here, the hours of work range from 66 to 72 iours weekly and labor will average 40 er cent less in price.
