OUTREE, Okla.-Chandler, an interior noom town fifty miles from Guthrie, is a mass of rains. At 6 o'clock last evening Green Peas. GIVE THEM A percepting in its path, swept down and almost completely wiped it of the face of the earth. Of her 1,500 inhabitants, twenty-six were killed outright or burned to death, and fully 170 were injured. Of the latter it is thought fourteen will die, and twentyfour others are in a dangerous condition

nage began before the inhabitants realzed what was upon them and hardly any neans of escape was left open. Tearing th ough the business district stores were lifted high into the air and tossed in every direction. The courthouse, in which Chief Justic Oale was holding court, was taken off

its foundation. Passing on into the reslence district, the wind continued it avoc, and rushing into the open counry finally spent itself. The trail left wa one of ruin. Houses rested on their topand streets were piled high with debris Soon fire followed the cyclone's work and here and there flames glared against tae dark sky. In a short time a heavy rain storm came up. As night wore or it developed into a deluge, and while it succeeded in completing the dismal scenthe rain probably proved the salvation of

the town. Daylight brought hundreds of people rom surrounding towns, and men, wonen and children assisted in caring for the injured. Little progress was made however, and it was not until noon that in organized effort for alleviating the suffering of the injured was made. The our remaining buildings were turned into hospitals, and the work proceeded as wiftly as possible.

It is difficult to estimate the total ontaining an area of about 4,000 square niles, dotted with farm houses and smal villages will be flooded.




