## THE STATE CAPITAL.

### Senator Butler's Waning Star in This State.

Russ again Nominated Mayor of Raleigh. Postoffice Receipts Larger. Negro Guards in Place of White. Annex for Penitentiary. Base Ball. Governor Going to Tennessee.

JOURNAL BUREAU, RALEIGH, N. C., April 6. Last night the city primaries were held and our popular present Mayor William Russ was nominated. The rest of the ticket is a good one. The election comes in May.

Ex-Chief Justice Shepherd has been retained by Attorney General Walter to appear for him as special counsel in the suit of the Southern Railway about the lease of the N. C. R. R. The Attorney-General will vindicate his right to bring certain suits in his discretion as representing the sovereignty of the State and to allow the Governor to present through him all questions as to validity of the lease except the charge of fraud by the directors.

The receipts at the Raleigh postoffice for fiscal year ending April 6, 1897, were \$32,583.19. In 1894 they were \$35,000— and have increased \$2,000 every year since. This office handles more second class matter than any other office of its rank in the United States.

The case of Harris and Harrell was not heard this morning but postponed.

Negro guards were appointed at the State farms and the white guards who were retained resigned immediately.

Gov. Russell sent his answer to Greensboro on the restraining order and he will be represented by his counsel—he remaining here. The result of the hearing will be watched with interest.

Lieut. Shipp who has been military instructor for Davis' School at Winston will after this session return to his regiment in Montana. Lieut. Shipp married Miss Margie Busbee of this city.

An annex is to be built at the penitentiary for the criminal insane. The legislature provided for them in this way by an appropriation of \$3,000 per annum.

The railroad appeals from the verdict of the jury in giving Norton \$20,000 damages.

The Experiment Station has on hand some Rame roots and these will be distributed this month among farmers and truckers in the Eastern part of the State provided they will agree to cultivate these roots according to the directions furnished and they are to report the result in the fall. It furnishes a strong fibre and makes a fabric like silk.

Philadelphia cancels the game of ball they were to have played here tomorrow with Wake Forest. The Boston League team have challenged the Wake Forest team to play here Thursday.

Governor Russell has decided to go to Nashville, Tenn., May 1, if nothing prevents and has accepted the offer of the Asheville Light Infantry to be his special escort.

Ex-Lt. Gov. Chas. Stedman has returned to N. C. from Atlanta and will make his home at Greensboro.

Just after the election of Senator Pritchard, Butler had a meeting of the Township Executive Committee called to demand the resignation of State Senator Early as county chairman of Bertie because he voted for Pritchard. There are 9 townships. At the first meeting were 5 chairmen, 3 for Early, 2 against. Another meeting was called for Feb. 16th, with 3 for Early and 1 against, and another called for the 25th inst., 5 for and three against Early. This waning of Butler's star is evident in all the counties nearly.

Late News Items.

The name of Mr. Wallace W. Rawlings, to be postmaster at Asheville, N. C., has been sent to the Senate.

A new engine in the Lawrence cement mill, at Eddyville, broke while being tested. The force of escaping steam pinned the doors shut, and Augustus Carter and Richard Law were literally cooked to death.

Tom Sharkey and Jim Williams, champion of Utah, fought eight rounds before an audience of 1,500 people at the Salt Lake Athletic club. Sharkey was the winner. There was no decision, although to sailor had the best of it.

It is estimated that the losses sustained by cattle men during the recent storm will range from 5 to 20 per cent. The snow lies one and a half feet deep in Cherokee, and from five to ten feet in the ravines. Much anxiety is felt for many persons reported missing.

Frank Lamont, the wounded Englishman who was imprisoned in the jail at Guantanamo, but was recently liberated. It was on the understanding that he would leave the island that the Spanish authorities liberated him. He was placed in the custody of the British consul at Santiago de Cuba, and has sailed from that port for Philadelphia by the steamer Harwood.

Chauncey M. Depew is a prisoner at his home in New York City, confined by his physicians, who decided that, as he would not be moderate in his attention to business, he must remain in his room and see none but members of his family, that he may recover from the attack of urticaria, from which he suffers.

## THE INJUNCTION CASE.

North Carolina Railroad Matter Continued to June 8th, at Asheville. No Arguments Heard Yet.

Special RALEIGH, N. C., April 6.—At Greensboro today the North Carolina Railway lease injunction case, was continued until June 8, at Asheville, by Judge Simonton.

The case was simply presented today, but there was no argument made.

## Senator Pritchard on Tariff.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Senator Pritchard has given notice that he will offer the following amendment to the Dingley tariff bill: Removing from the free list ore as pyrites or suboxide of iron in its natural state, and making it dutiable at \$2.25 per ton; removing emery ore from the free list and making it dutiable at 15 cents per pound; also imposing a similar duty on emery grain, making all leguminous at the rate of \$2 per 1,000 feet; imposing a duty of 2 cents per pound on raw cotton; fixing a specific duty of 6 cents per pound on manazite, and instead of the ad valorem, as now provided, increasing the duty of kaolin to a \$2 to \$3 per ton. The amendments have been referred to the Finance Committee, and Senator Pritchard is confident that they will be adopted by the committee.

## THE PROBABLE PLAN.

The Machinery Act May be Adjusted to Meet the Case.

It is reported that Auditor Ayer will send out his statement under which the taxes will be listed in a few days. It will make it out according to the revenue act of the last Assembly, with the property tax at 16 on the \$100 worth of property and the poll at \$1.20. The Governor will then apply for a mandamus to compel the Auditor to make the poll tax equal to the tax on \$300, worth of property, as the constitution requires. The matter will thus be carried to the courts and decided as early as possible.

The Attorney General says that he has been unable to find any case like this on record. In all the other machinery acts the constitutional question between the property and poll tax has been observed.

## AFTER THE PLUMS.

North Carolinians Who Expect Something to Drop.

The Washington Post of the 6th has the following in regard to North Carolinians who are after Some of the Good Things Which Go to the Faithful.

"Col. A. D. Cowles, of North Carolina, who is an applicant for the mission to Greece, went home yesterday with the assurance that his name will be sent in shortly."

Other North Carolinians who are here, and hope to make a political landing before many more days roll around, are John C. Duncay, who is said, has good reason to expect the appointment of Recorder of Deeds for the District of Columbia; Henry C. Dockery, who is credited with the Collectorship of Internal Revenue for the Fourth District; Winston McLaury, who expects to get the post office at Charlotte; ex-representative Brower, who was a candidate for the Marshalship of the Western District, which was given to Mr. Millen, and who has the promise of something equally as good; Dr. W. H. Wheeler, formerly postmaster at Winston, who has the promise of receiving his old place again; A. E. Holton, who now has no opposition in his candidacy for United States District Attorney for the Western District since Col. M. L. Mott withdrew in his favor; J. E. Shepherd, a colored politician of Durham, who is a candidate for Fourth Auditor of the Treasury; G. J. Spruce, who was elected at large, and has the support of the entire delegation for United States District Attorney for the Eastern District; and H. A. Gauder, who is a candidate for the Brazilian Mission, and now has little hope of landing, as he was given to understand that this place has been practically promised to ex-representative Cooper, of Michigan."
