THE STATE CAPITAL.

rop Conditions. Marriages in Raleigh. Address Issued to the Alliance. Russell Case Postponed.

JOURNAL BUREAU, RALEIGH, N. C., April 7. Yesterday the first weekly crop report of the season was issued by the weather bureau. It is by no means a favorable report of the condition of things on account of the rain, the warm weather early in March, and then the sudden cold spell. The frost did considerable damage to fruit.

The air is full of talk of the coming weddings of several of Raleigh's ladies. Mr. Frank Myers of Charlotte, N. C., and Miss Roberta Smith will be married on April 20th. Mr. Simers of Chicago and Miss Maggie Smith on the 21st. Mr. D. Addison Cable and Miss Helena Horne on the 14th, and there are others whose names are not given to the public as yet. There will be 20 delegates from Missouri to the Southern Interstate Insurance conference at Southern Pines.

Secretary Barnes of the State Alliance issued an address to the Alliance in which he tells them that a most critical time in their history has come, and that the trouble comes from within. He says the Alliance have come in and interfered with industrial enterprises, and that the result is a standstill. The membership is very much reduced. Governor Russell in his answer to the junction says he will not recognize a party that interferes with the powers of a Sovereign State. There was nothing on with the case at Greensboro yesterday except to hear the answers and postpone the case until in June. The case of the Atlantic and North Carolina Railroads will be heard June 9 at Asheville.

Governor Russell pardons Henry Harrison of Greenville who was put in the penitentiary for assault on a political quarrel and also pardons ex-treasurer Benson who was convicted of embezzling \$8,000 of the county funds.

Work is being pushed on the new annex to the insane asylum here so as to be ready for use by June 1st. It will be complete with wards for male patients, with rooms, dining rooms, etc.

The Superintendent of Public Instruction says he knew there would be opposition to the new law to encourage location for public schools.

Clara Claudius Dockery is to deliver an address May 30, union decoration day, at the National cemetery at Salisbury.

There is a great deal of interest being shown in the coming Teacher's Assembly meeting—more so than for a number of years. It is said that the Department of Justice is by no means pleased with Judge T. P. Dick for so long U. S. District Judge from Greensboro.

The Spring Elections.

CHICAGO.—The mayoralty election resulted in a decided victory for the regular Democratic ticket, whose candidate, Carter H. Harrison, received more votes than the other candidates combined. His majority was estimated at 50,000. The campaign was contested for the most part on strictly local issues, although the Democrats had a plank in their platform praising Hon. Wm. J. Bryan. Harrison boldly announced that he opposed civil-service reform as far as "a wide open town." Sears and other candidates were for civil-service reform and wanted the saloons closed on Sundays and after midnight. All the candidates except Harrison and Sears were opposing machine methods in politics.

Carter H. Harrison is the son of an same name of Mayor Harrison, who was assassinated in the closing days of the World's Fair. The popularity of his father was a great advantage to the mayor elect in his campaign. He is 35 years old, and has never held a political office. Mr. Harrison was educated at Heidelberg and Yale. During the greater part of his recent career he has been associated in the real estate business with his brother, Preston Harrison. He was the business manager of the Chicago Times during the four years, when the Harrison family owned that newspaper.

ST. LOUIS, Mo.—The Republicans elected their mayor in this city. **CLEVELAND, Ohio.**—Complete returns of Monday's election give McKisson, Republican, 2,500 plurality over Farley Democrat. The other candidate on the Republican ticket have pluralities ranging up to 10,000.

WINONA, Minn.—The city election here resulted in a Republican victory, E. K. Tarbell, Republican, being successful by 14 majority.

BUTTE, Mont.—The Democrats at the local election carried the city, winning by majorities ranging from 500 to 900 against the Republicans and Populists.

SCHENECTADY, N. Y.—The town elections in Schenectady county resulted in Democratic victories, with two exceptions. Last fall every town in the county gave Republican pluralities.

HARRIS FOR PRESIDENT.

loom for the Kansas Senator as a Rival of Hon. Wm. J. Bryan. Starts in His Own State.

TOPEKA, Kan.—For some time the possible candidacy of the United States Senator Wm. A. Harris, of Kansas, for the nomination for the presidency by the union silver forces in 1900 has been a subject of gossip among Kansas politicians. The Daily Capital in this connection says:

"A little political cloud no bigger than a hair has risen over Mr. Bryan's chances for the leadership of the agrarian forces of 1900. Mr. Harris is being urged by his friends to make the attempt."

Senator Harris is a native of Virginia and was recently elected to the Senate to succeed Wm. A. Peffer.

Late News Items.

Twenty persons were killed and many others were wounded by an explosion in fireworks factory in Lisbon, Portugal. Amund Dowleb has been appointed resident of the council of ministers and interior of the interior of Persia with extensive powers.

The Congress will grant a syndicate of Washington capitalists a permission to build an electric railroad on the Frey street from Puerto Calallos to Truxillo in Honduras.

Dr. von Stephan, the imperial postmaster-general, who was to have been the chief representative of Germany at the Washington postal congress, is dying. Professor Pergmann recently amputated Dr. Stephan's right leg below the knee, and the patient has been gradually sinking ever since.

The conservative members of the Reichstag have given notice that they will interpellate the imperial chancellor Prince Hohenlohe, as to whether, in view of the United States tariff, and particularly the mark differential treatment of German sugar, the federal government intend to adhere to the agreement of August 22, 1791, with the United States.

A special dispatch from Rome says that the Prince of Montenegro, owing to the gravity of the situation, has started suddenly on his return to Montenegro. It is understood he believes, in the event of an outbreak on the frontier, that the war will extend to Albania and Montenegro wishes to be in a position to occupy North Albania as far south as the river Drin, including the town of Scutari.
