be present attitude of Greece ermands the admiration of the world, and outside of the pecuniar interests involved in the destruction of Turkey, the European Power would gladly see the final dissoltion of this Empire which has cause untold horrors, and blocked ti progress of civilization for a cer tary.

From all reports, it seems the Greece will find it impossible to d feat Turkey upon the battlefield, . her army is about one half the siof that of Turkey's, and there seem little chance of aronsing the adicent countries of Bulgaria, Servi Roumania which have hithorto a ways been ready for revolt. The countries are now settled along line of government so that they cannwell join Greece if they desired.

The reports coming from the battles now going on between tl urks and Greeks must be accept with caution, the final result is no likely to be far distant, and wit that will decide to a great exten the "integrity" of Turkey.

The present war like every other one in which the overthrow of th Turkish empire was threatened will again see an effort made to pre serve the "integrity of the Ottomas Empire," not from any principle involved, but for the sake of the bond holders and the other holders of Turkish securities.

Neither country enters upon this contest with the prospect of gaining any territory, and losses to each out be the only result.
