WILL DISSOLVE.
Tucker & Co. File Deed for Dissolu-
tion of Partnership.

RALEIGH, N. C., June 1.—The firm of
"Tucker & Co." filed a deed of trust to-
day, to dissolve the partnership of the
present firm by James Boyland, T. W.
Dobbin and Wm. Boylan.
The doors are closed to take stock.
The assets will far exceed the liabil-
ities.
None of the partners claim exemption
from firm assets. The firm was estab-
lished in 1818.
MORGAN'S THREAT.
His Declarations (That the House
Sessions Are Unconstitutional
Worries Some. Recd Undisturbed.
WASHINGTON, May 31.—The point made
by Senator Morgan in the Senate that
the present proceedings in the House under
the rule for semi-weekly sessions with its
adjournments for three days are unconsti-
tutional is giving some anxiety to some
of the Republican leaders.
The question was discussed today by
several Republican members of the ways
and means committee, who were in the
committee room, and two of them ex-
pressed the opinion that Senator Morgan's
view might prove to be correct. The pos-
sibility that importers may stir up litigation
over the tariff bill after it becomes
a law, following the suggestion by Sena-
tor Morgan that Congress would not be
legally in session when the Senate passes
the bill, is viewed with some apprehen-
sion by a minority of the committee,
though not by Mr. Dingley.
Speaker Reed, it is understood, does
not in the least share the apprehension of
those who think there is something in
the point, and believes that the House
can fix the days of its adjournment.
There will be an effort on the part of
some Senators to have the Senate com-
mittee on contingent expenses amend
the Tillman resolution for an investiga-
tion of the charges that Senators have
been speculating in sugar stocks so as to
have the inquiry made by a standing
committee.

WEEKLY CROP REPORT.
Rains Were Beneficial. Crops Have
Suffered From Drought and
Worms.
RALEIGH, June 1st.—The past week
has been unfavorable, being too cool
throughout North Carolina, considerably
checking growth of crops. The weather
was also dry until the end of the week,
excepting light rain, with some hail, in
the northern portion on 24th. The warm
rates of Saturday and Sunday were gen-
eral and will be of immense benefit. Farm
work has been well kept up. Cotton and
corn continue small; some cotton has
died out from cool nights, and the stand
of corn is poor. Tobacco is growing off
slowly. Wheat has about headed and is
beginning to turn. Blackberries are
abundant. Crops are in excellent con-
dition to be benefited by suitable seasons,
and next week's reports will probably in-
dicate great improvement.
EASTERN DISTRICT.—Excepting at a few
points where good rains occurred on the
24th, the past week was hard on crops,
being altogether too cool and dry up to
the 28th, so that crops are making
rather poor progress. Some hail occurred
in the extreme eastern portion on 24th.
Crops are everywhere clean and well
cultivated, and the warm showers the
last of the week will be extremely ben-
eficial. Cotton looks poorly and some has
died out; it is nearly all chopped out;
fair stand, but growth slow. Corn con-
tinues backward and stand poor, and
much damage has been done by cut
worms. Tobacco has been nearly all
transplanted, with fair stand, but plants
are small and require warmth and mois-
ture. Some complaints of damage by
bea bugs and buttoning. Peanuts are
coming up fairly well. Irish potatoes
are being shipped; small and poor. Sweet
potato sprouts are being set out.

PEACH FOR TWO WEEKS.
The Sultan of Turkey Agrees to a Fur-
ther Suspension of Hostilities
Pending Negotiations With Greece
CONSTANTINOPLE.—An trade has just
been issued and communicated to the
representatives of the powers by which
the Sultan agrees to an armistice of a
fortnight beginning May 26th. Fresh
instructions, consequently, will be sent
to Edhem Pasha, the Turkish commander
in Thrace.
The ambassadors are urging the Tur-
kish government to engage to prolong
the armistice in the event of the peace
negotiations not being ended when the
armistice expires.
The Greek government has issued a
Special of the report that an anti-dynas-
tic movement is on foot, and it also de-
clines the substance of discussions between
King George and the government of
Greece.
