### FATAL COLLISION.

One Train Loaded with Christian Endeavorers Crushed Into Another.

CHICAGO, Ill., June 30.—Three persons were killed outright and about twenty or thirty injured in a rear-end collision on the Chicago and Northwestern road at 12:45 this morning, at West Chicago, thirty miles out from the city, on the Galena Division.

The victims of the collision were Christian Endeavor delegates, who left Chicago last night en route for the great convention in San Francisco. The colliding trains were sections Nos. 4 and 8 of a Christian Endeavor special sent out in nine sections, beginning at 10:30 p. m. Section No. 5 ran into section No. 4, which left Chicago fifteen minutes ahead of it. Section No. 5 came up behind at great speed, and the shock of the collision was terrific. The passengers in the two rear sleepers of section No. 4 were all in their berths. They received no warning, and those not killed outright awoke to find themselves jammed in the wreckage.

## AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE.

### The Executive Committee Selects Assistant Teachers.

Secretary Overton Resigned. Very Hot with Cloudless Sky. Cattle Quarantine. Two Much Work for the Auditor's Office.

JOURNAL BUREAU, RALEIGH, N. C., July 1.

The executive committee of the board of agriculture yesterday elected the following assistant teachers for the A. & M. college: L. R. Whitted, Physics; J. W. Carroll, Dairyman; W. A. G. Clark, Civil engineering; Leo Watson, Mechanical engineering; Hugh Primrose, chemical department. Three of these are Raleigh boys, and they are all past graduates of the college.

Mr. John C. Scarborough ex-superintendent of public instruction has been elected president of the Chowan Baptist Institute.

Secretary Overton who has for two years been the Secretary of the Y. M. C. A. has resigned.

Yesterday was the hottest day of the season so far the thermometer reaching 96 degrees and a fraction, and today is a companion piece to yesterday. The sun beats down in all its intensity and not a cloud in the sky.

Commissioners of Agriculture Mewborne and Mr. J. G. L. Harris will go to Washington, D. C. in a few days to see the Secretary of Agriculture in regard to the cattle quarantine line.

The health of the city was splendid all during the month of June. There were only 11 deaths in the city.

Today the railroad commission takes up the question of better accommodations for the negroes at the Union depot here. There is great complaint that they are not properly looked after.

State Auditor Ayer is disgusted because the legislature puts so much more work in his office than was formerly done in the auditors office, and did not provide for an extra help. A sum of \$3,500 for "contingencies" was taken from the State Treasurers office.

### SPAIN HESITATES.

In the Trial and Sentences of the Competitor Crew. Men Laughing in Prison.

HAVANA.—The trial of the Competitor crew will not take place on July 1, as has been reported. It may not take place for several months yet unless the United States government presses the case.

The authorities here hesitate to bring the men to trial for diplomatic reasons. They realize the fact that if the laws of Spain mean anything and are not to be brought into disrepute, the sentence of the Competitor filibusters must be severe. On the other hand, Spain does not desire to aggravate any hostile feeling that may already exist in the United States against her.

In the meantime the Competitor crew are languishing in prison. Some of them cannot stand confinement much longer. Melton's health for example, is broken down beyond recovery.
