## GONE TO WASHINGTON.

To Change Quarantine Line and Mailing Grades.

Printing to be Done Cheaper. Russell and Grant are Friends. Improvements for the Blind. Journal Editorials.

JOURNAL BUREAU. RALEIGH, N. C., July 21. Mr. J. C. L. Harris and Commissioner of Agriculture Newborne have gone to Washington to try and have the cattle quarantine line changed, and to get the Agricultural Bulletin mailed as second class matter. The quarantine line runs over the Blue Ridge and they want the line extended to North Wilkesboro which is a large cattle shipping point.

The regular meeting of the board of directors of the penitentiary was to be held today, but it was deferred until August 18th when all the Democrats who were retained in office there will be ousted.

Barnes Bros. the new State printers have been given the contract for printing the matter of the Agricultural Department. They say they will print the Bulletin so much cheaper than Stewart Bros. did that the department can afford to pay the new rate of postage demanded, one cent a copy.

The fact that Governor Russell and Maj. Grant have become friends is a matter of considerable comment among the Republicans.

Cotton has arrived here shipped from New York for use in one of the cotton mills here.

Stewart Bros. ex-State printers are here closing up that business. They waive their claim for printing fertilizer tags which is the disallowed claim.

The Labor commissioner is having prepared new blanks for farm products returns and also a special blank for truck crops, fertilizers etc.

There are many improvements being made at the Institution for the white blind here.

The summer school at the University is said to be the best this summer of any ever held there.

The fine rains all over the State have done much for the crops. The rain fall this week in different parts of the State has ranged from 1 to 2 1/2 inches.

Prof. Claxton of Greensboro and Prof. Toms of the University will publish the N. C. Journal of Education. It will be published at Greensboro and will begin next month.

The New Berne JOURNAL's editorials last week on the discussion of reduction of rates before the R. R. Commission and the choice of the three men who presented papers before the commission, are heartily endorsed by the majority of those who saw them. More such straight forward editorials are badly needed in this State.

The Navy Department has recently approved a new design for turrets for the great 18-inch guns that are to be mounted on the battle-ship Alabama, Wisconsin and Illinois unlike any carried on other vessels of war and the strongest and most invulnerable ever planned. In these turrets the new battle-ships will have guns installed capable of the most destructive fire and at the same time rendering the most exposed part of the turret impervious to bombardment. The main features of the turret are vertical walls on the rear and sides with sloping plates at the front. Ample room is thus given to the turret crew, while a thick plate at great inclination is presented to the enemy's fire in front.

## COTTON WAS LOWER.

Rain, Lower Foreign Market, Large Crop Estimate.

Legitimate Stocks Advance. Sugar Holders Sell. Wheat Active. Three Cents Higher. Markets Generally Bullish.

SPECIAL TO JOURNAL. NEW YORK, July 21—The Legitimate Stock market came up for activity under the leadership of Rock Island, on increased earnings, and prices showed new records on the advance.

The Industrial stocks were erratic. Good selling of Sugar caused a decline of three dollars a share.

Chicago Gas was strong, on talk of an extra dividend.

Cotton was weak on lower Liverpool, more rain and reports of larger crop estimates from the South. There was good buying on the decline.

Wheat opened weak on lower foreign markets, but the offerings were absorbed quickly.

Foreigners rebought, causing a wild market, with a three cent a bushel advance.

Tomorrow's holiday in Chicago may affect prices somewhat but we are still bullish.

### Latest News Items.

The new light draft gunboat Annapolis was placed in commission at the navy-yard, Brooklyn, the ceremonies being witnessed by a large crowd of spectators and many of the naval officers on duty at the yard.

Jean Ingelow, the well-known poetess and novelist died at Kensington, Miss. Ingelow was born at Boston, Lincolnshire in 1820.

It is reported from London that the negotiations between the American bimetallic commission and the representatives of France and Great Britain have now reached a stage which renders it extremely probable that Great Britain will agree to participate in a conference to be held in Washington next fall.

Ethem Pasha, commander-in-chief of the Turkish forces in Thessaly, was the recipient of an infernal machine, which exploded while it was being opened, severely wounding Ethem Pasha's arm.

A severe snow-storm is reported from all the higher portions in the mountain districts of Colorado. Three inches of snow is reported at Cripple Creek, Aspen and other points and one inch at Leadville. The weather is uncomfortably cool even in Denver.

Mails by the steamship Queen, which arrived recently from Alaska, bring news of the exodus of miners and business men from Juneau to the number of 350, and from all accounts the fever bids fair to carry away nearly every able bodied man in the place, so intent has the excitement over the new discoveries on the Klondike become.

Delegate Thomas Estrada Palma received a letter dated July 4th from General Maximo Gomez, which says in part: "It is our purpose to make this summer's campaign as active and aggressive as possible. To carry out our plans successfully we will need rather than anything else a steady supply of ammunition. For that we depend on the support of patriotic Cubans and friends abroad."

### McKINLEY AND THE STRIKE.

He Has Not Yet Replied to the Request for Mediation. WASHINGTON, July 20.—The President today received the resolution adopted yesterday by the Pittsburg Council, asking him to use his good offices in the settlement of the coal strike, but has not yet sent a reply. He has also received many communications and suggestions on the subject, but it is impossible that he will take any action in the matter in the absence of any definite plan for the settlement of the strike.

The Cabinet today discussed the matter informally. The only absentees from the meeting were Secretary Sherman, who is not yet well enough to go out, and Secretary Alger, who is in the West. No questions of general interest were discussed.

It has been decided to send in the currency message to Congress as soon as the party leaders in the Senate consider the time opportune.

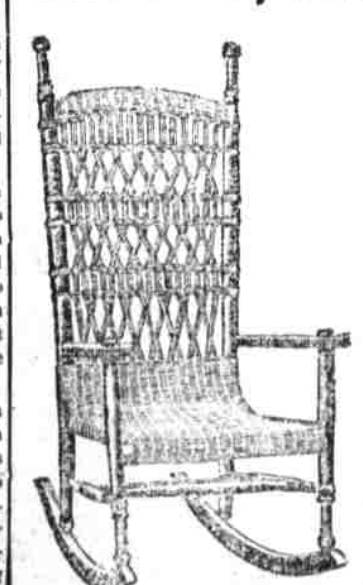
