CIGARETTE LAW.

The Tax Must be Paid Before Removal.

More Cotton from North to South. Butler's New Issue. Distillers Convention. R. R. Commission Meets Saturday. Worth's New Idea.

JOURNAL BUREAU. Raleigh, N. C., July 29. The Raleigh Cotton mill on yesterday secured five car loads of cotton from New York.

The revenue collector for this district (the 4th) is ordered to allow no cigarettes to be removed until the new \$1.00 stamps are put on. The old stamp was 50 cts. Cigars weighing over 3 lbs. per 1,000 pay \$3 per 1,000 and those under 3 lbs. pay \$1.00.

Senator Butler in an editorial in the Caucasian says public ownership of national monopolies will be the coming campaign issue.

The convention of N. C. Liquor Dealers Distillers and grape growers association will meet in Durham on the 24th 25th and 26th of August.

The cotton seed oil men from all over the South will meet in Asheville Monday August 2nd.

The R. R. commission will meet on Saturday again to hear exceptions to the tax valuations as made last year.

The annex to the Academy of music which is being built for Barnes Bros., public printers, is going up rapidly.

Last night one of the circles of the King's Daughters gave a lovely trolley party. There were three brilliantly illuminated cars coupled together. A brass band played as the cars sped along the track.

Col. P. H. Tybrook of Winston has accepted the chief Marshals'hip of the State Fair in October.

Governor Russell and quite a large party will go on August 14th to Old Point Virginia Beach, Ocean View and all the resorts in that vicinity.

Treasurer Worth says that only 7 of the property in the State is taxed. His idea seems to be to make corporations pay taxes on their property at full cash value, while lands do not pay taxes on over 4 of the actual value.

Twenty convicts were today sent to dig 600 car loads of gravel for the S. A. L. near Carthage.

Big Coal Mine Deal.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn.—Mr. Henry Taylor, the representative of the English syndicate which has an option on most of the coal mines in East Tennessee, has arrived here. The deal is practically closed, only awaiting Mr. Taylor's inspection of the properties and final report. The price approaches five million dollars and the properties employ 3,000 miners and have an output of about 3,000,000 tons of coal annually.

SUPPLIES FOR CUBANS.

Pilbustering Expeditions Said to be Fitting Out at Wilmington, N. C.

WASHINGTON, July 28.—Two pilbustering expeditions are reported to be preparing to leave Wilmington, N. C., and the federal authorities, in pursuance of the government's policy to prevent such departures from the United States, will take steps to intercept them. The information comes to the State Department from the Spanish minister, whose spies and detectives along the Southern seaboard are most energetic and alert and have defeated many plans of the Cuban insurgents to secure munitions of war. The two vessels under suspicion are the schooner John D. Long and the tug Alex. Jones, both now at Wilmington. It is said their movements have been suspicious of late, and spies report that a large expedition will soon sail for Cuba with supplies unless the authorities prevent it.

Remembering the tricks played by the Dauntless in decoying the warships to a chase at sea only to allow time for some expedition to slip away, the authorities are on guard and do not propose to leave unprotected the far Southern coast to watch supposed filibusters who may be playing the same trick.

This is the time, however, when the Cubans should receive substantial aid if they hope to continue a successful campaign this autumn. The rainy season is drawing to a close, and hostilities may soon begin again. The cry of the insurgents, their representatives here say, is still for arms and ammunition.
