BIG MINE PROJECT.

Chicago Corporation Organized to Control Gold Fields.

Klondyke Belongs to England Beyond Doubt. Many Sailings for Alaska. Receipts of Gold at San Francisco Mint Beats all Records.

CHICAGO, Ill., August 4.—John Cudaby is at the head of a corporation to be capitalized at \$25,000,000, which is to own and develop nearly all the gold quartz mines in Eastern Alaska, which have been discovered up to this time.

The corporation will own properties the present value of which at the lowest estimate is \$500,000,000. The organization is an outgrowth of the North American Transportation and Trading Company, which incorporated five years ago under the laws of Illinois with a capital stock of \$450,000. It had two objects, doing business as a common carrier and prospecting for minerals. John Cudaby is the largest individual stockholder, and is understood to control a majority of the shares.

Doubt having been thrown upon the ownership of the Klondyke gold fields, government officials who would naturally be expected to deal with the question if it should come to a practical issue have been quietly looking into it, with a view of preparing themselves for any controversy that may arise. Their views are in substance that there can be no valid objection to the title of Great Britain to this territory.

The steamer George E. Starr has left for Alaska with ninety passengers and twenty horses. August 9 the steamer Queen will go North. She will carry between 500 and 600 passengers. On the same date the steam barge Ajax, laden with live stock, will be started for Dyea. August 8 the ship Klondyke, chartered by Tacoma men, will sail. On the same day the steamer Coquitlan will sail from Vancouver. Seven other departures are set for later in the month.

All mint records were broken by the receipts at San Francisco, when \$3,700,000 in gold were deposited for coinage. Of this amount \$750,000 was the property of the Alaska Commercial Company, and the remainder was deposited by various miners and smelting companies. It is said that this far exceeds any other single day's deposits at any one mint.

HUDSON RIVER TUNNEL.

Plans to Build It to Jersey City. NEW YORK, Aug. 4.—Plans are being made to push to completion the Hudson river tunnel project, connecting New York and Jersey City. The law firm of Lord, Day & Lord, who represent the English bondholders in this country, will file papers in foreclosure within a few days against the tunnel property. It will be sold and bid in by the stockholders, removing obstacles to a reorganization with a new issue of bonds. The total length of the tunnel will be 5,400 feet. Of this 4,000 feet were completed when the work was abandoned in 1892, owing to the death of Mr. Park, its chief financial supporter. The plans have been changed so as to remove the New York terminal from Washington Square to some point west of Broadway.

BEAR MOVEMENT FAILS.

Stocks Advance Sharply From Early Break.

Cotton Prices Rule Within Narrow Range. Dull Foreign Buying and Heavy Receipts Causes Three Cent Decline in Wheat.

SPECIAL TO JOURNAL. NEW YORK, August 5.—A tremendous effort made by the Bears to break stocks, resulted in a point decline. About the time the sentimentalists seemed to control, Louisville and Nashville reported over one hundred thousand dollars increased earnings.

The Bears covered rapidly and the market advanced quickly, scoring at close the highest prices in present movement.

Looks as if the upward movement might continue sometime.

Cotton—Liverpool was fairly strong with a quiet market. Favorable crop reports were the bearish features.

Market continues in a narrow channel. Will have movement when spinners resume operations.

Wheat—Liverpool came lower, first time in weeks.

Receipts at all primary points were heavy and foreigners bought very little.

Profit taking by St. Louis and Chicago were features.

The Bears joined in and a three cent break from last night's close ensued.

We anticipated this, and believe a break of a cent further, then renewed foreign buying will rally prices.

Volcano Destruction.

TACOMA, Wash., August 4.—Five hundred reported killed up to July 1 is the record of the outbreak of the great volcano of Mayon, on the Island of Luzon, one of the Philippine group. All night of June 24 the volcano was throwing up ashes and lava in immense quantities, and flames flash considerably more than 100 feet above the crater. The next day fifty-six bodies were recovered, and the most recent dispatches in Hong Kong stated that not less than 500 were known to be killed.
