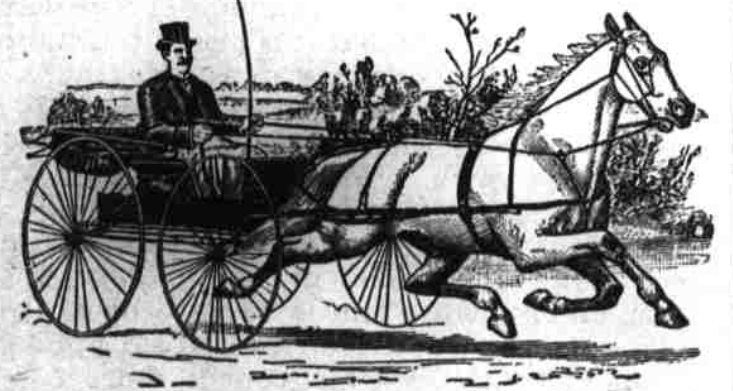

AN OFFICIAL APPEAL.

Attempt to Strengthen the School Election Law.

Applicants For Attorney Licenses. Valuation of Railways and Steamships. Fire at the County Home- Rain all Around. Quaker's Meeting.

RALEIGH, August 7.--The State Superintendent of Public Instruction has issued the following:

"To the Teachers and Friends of Public Schools: I call upon you as patriotic citizens of North Carolina to go to the polls on next Tuesday and see that all may have an opportunity to vote for schools at your respective voting precincts. If the County Commissioners of your county have not prepared and distributed ballots, as the law directs them, you can write ballots with the words 'for schools' on paper, and these will do as well as the printed ballots. Next Tuesday will be a memorable day in the educational history of our State. What shall the record be? Will you help to make the record one over which you will have reason to rejoice? I trust you will do your duty on this important day."

The Supreme Court gives notice that September 27th, it will examine applicants for attorneys' licenses. The class will be a very large one.

Hon. John W. Daniel of Virginia and family are at Southport. His family will remain a month.

This county suffers \$2,000 loss by the burning of the barn and stable at the County Home. Several horses and mules and nine bags and all the farming implements were burned.

The State Auditor says that if the newly-created State Board of Tax Equalization is to do nothing, he does not think it should use the appropriation specially made.

In this section rain is needed by all crops, save cotton. Rain has fallen at many places during the past twenty-four hours.

The great "yearly meeting" of the Friends, or Quakers, is in progress at High Point. Sunday ten thousand people will gather there.

GOOD REPORTS.

Dunn and Bradstreet Say that Business is Improving.

New York, August 6.--R. G. Dunn's Weekly Review of Trade says: Four years ago, August 5, 1893, the first number of Dunn's Review was issued with failures in that month amounting to over \$60,000,000 while in the month just closed, failures have been only \$7,117,727 the smallest in any month since 1892. The pessimists who prophesied reports of gain fictitious and misrepresenting have grown weary of their dismal song and begin to look for better days.

Last month was the first for four years in which the volume of business reached by the clearing house, was larger than in the same month of 1892 and dispatches from all parts of the country given this week show a gratifying improvement. This is partly due to a large yield of wheat and prices, though the crop is probably not as large nor are prices thus far as high as in 1892, but of cotton the price is higher and the yield probably larger than in that year. Other farm products are realizing good prices and the possible decline in yield of corn may help to market the enormous surplus brought over from last year.

Bradstreet says: General trade shows the most pronounced gains this week at Chicago, St. Louis and Galveston. The feeling of confidence that general business is to improve in the early autumn is marked at these cities, and purchases of dry goods, clothing, shoes and other staples have increased heavily and are followed by a disposition to crowd prices up.

The movement of general merchandise throughout the country is unquestionably larger than last week, cotton goods and woolen industries are better off, and the stagnation in iron and steel has given way to a growing inquiry and increasing output. But more significant still is the extraordinary expansion in bank clearings this week and last month.

As to wheat (notwithstanding the reaction in September option) wheat, flour, pork, lard, Pacific Coast hops, sugar, soft cotton and tea. There is a 5 per cent. gain in Bessemer pig and manufacturers decline orders for future delivery at cut quotations. In fact, our predicted revival in iron and steel has appeared.

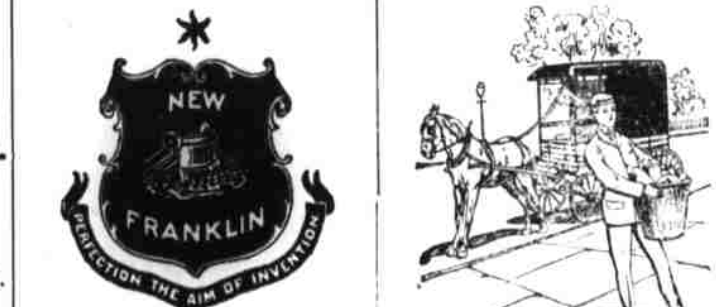
