LYNCHED AT ASHEVILLE. GETS LARGE DAMAGES.

Jail Broken in and the Negro Hanged to a Tree.
Military was Called Out. Governor Urged Citizens to Allow the Law to Take its Course. The Brute Meets His Just Deserts.

RALEIGH, N. C., August 11.—A mob stormed the jail at Asheville and broke into the interior to get the negro Bob Brackett.
The negro had been removed and had been placed on a train. He was taken from the train by the mob.
A telegram was sent to Governor Russell, saying that the mob had gotten the negro.
The military were called out and the Governor urged the citizens to respect the law and assured them that Brackett could be legally executed in two weeks, unless the jury should fail to convict.
Late this evening Brackett's body was found hanging from a tree.
The crime was committed near Asheville on Tuesday. The victim was Miss Kittle Henderson. The negro was caught and fully identified. He confessed the crime and was lodged in the county jail.

Fireman Gets \$2,500 from Yadkin Valley Railroad.
Improvement at Fair Grounds. Business in the State Improving. Bankers Association Incorporated. Meeting of Populist Committee.
RALEIGH, N. C., August 11.—At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the State Fair it was decided to let a sub-committee arrange for putting in permanent boilers for machinery and also to electrically light the buildings and grounds at night.
Seventy-five persons left here for Red Springs, Robeson county, to attend the Baptist Sunday School Chautauquus, which continues all this week. The gathering will be a large one.
Five negroes were sent to jail by Mayor Huss to-day for throwing stones at excursion trains here: They will all be sent to the penitentiary. The penalty is severe in this State for this offense.
The Cape Fear and Yadkin Valley Railway pays a fireman, McCuiston, \$2,500, as a compromise for a strange injury. He was under the engine, cleaning out the fire-box, when another engine bumped the one he was under. He was dragged over the glowing coals and horribly burned. He sued the road for \$5,000, under the new fellow servant liability law.
Commercial travellers agree in reporting business as extraordinary good in this State, with heavy orders, and a fine outlook—"the best certainly since 1889."
The State Board of Equalization of Taxes is to meet here on the 16th. It does not appear that, under the very defective law, it can do much this year or next.
The North Carolina Bankers' Association was incorporated by the Secretary of State, T. H. Battle, J. F. Burton and J. C. Hales being incorporators. The Business Men's Association of Durham, was also incorporated, the incorporators being W. A. Slater, A. E. Lloyd, L. W. Vaughan, T. J. Lambert, W. H. Proctor.
The semi-annual dividend \$90,000 on the North Carolina railway, was paid the State Tuesday.
The annual meeting of the State Farmers' Alliance has begun at Hillsboro.
Some interesting developments are looked for at the meeting of the Populist State Committee here to-day.
Senator Butler is working like a beaver to have things go his way. There is a strong element working to crush him.

Negro on Trial.

RALEIGH, N. C., August 11.—George Davis, alias Doctor Davis, the Raleigh negro, who it is alleged outraged and killed a negro girl in Chowan County, and who is in custody here, will be before Judge Montgomery in habes corpus proceedings tomorrow.

Secretary Sherman Annoyed.
WASHINGTON, August 10.—Secretary Sherman is very much annoyed at the criticisms of London newspapers in regard to the statements attributed to him in a recent interview in the New York World. He disavows authority for such statements, and says it would be foolish to hold him responsible for all the statements the newspapers credit him with having made about foreign affairs. Beyond a general denial of all recent alleged interviews, he refuses to talk about the matter.

GRIEVING FOR CANOVAS.
Will Be Interred in the Pantheon With Great Honors.
MADRID, August 10.—The Queen Regent has decreed that the military honors observed in the case of the funeral of a marshal shall be accorded the remains of the late Premier of Spain, Senor Canovas Del Castillo.
The body of the Spanish statesman will arrive here on Wednesday morning, accompanied by his widow with the Minister for the Colonies, representing the Queen Regent.
The pall-bearers will be an academian, an admiral, the president of the Senate, a knight of the Golden Fleece and Marshal Martinez De Campos. The interment will take place in the Pantheon. Funeral services will take place simultaneously in all the churches throughout the country, and the official mourning will last three days.

Spaniards Meet Defeat.
HAVANA, Cuba, August 10.—Official information has reached Havana of a decisive battle between loyal troops and insurgent forces in Matanzas. According to this information the Spanish troops were routed, after a hard battle, with heavy losses.
This news caused a veritable sensation in Havana, as it is generally known that Captain-General Weyler is now in Matanzas, and there is a general belief that the Spanish troops directly under him were those who suffered defeat at the hands of the rebels.
