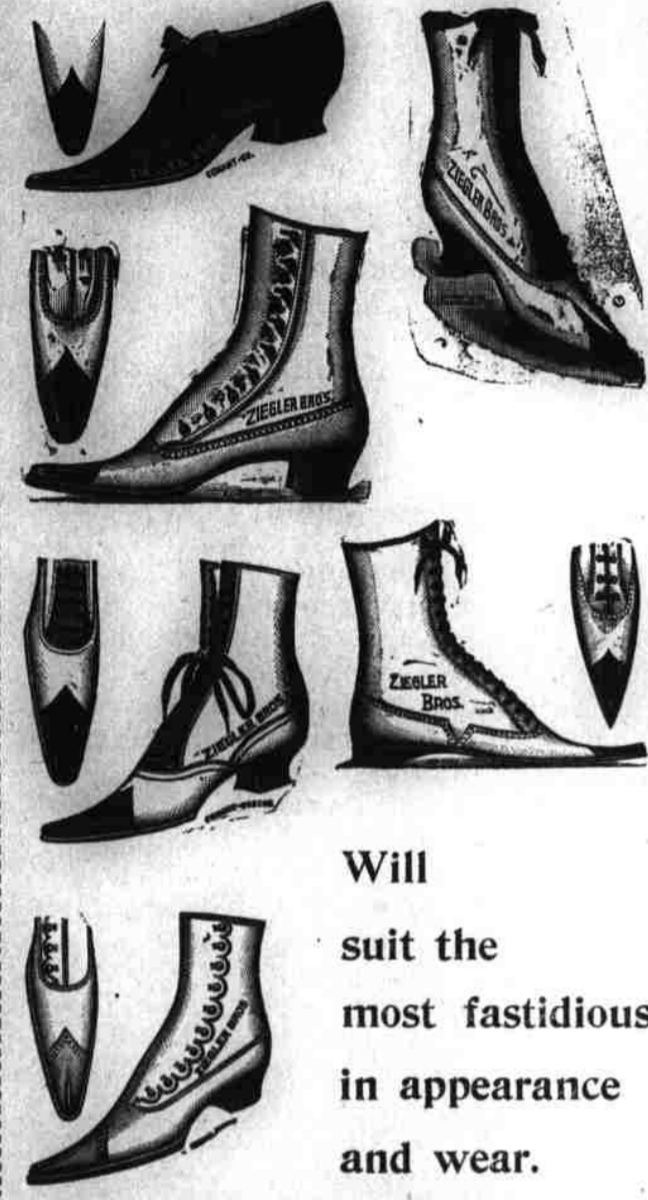

DESIRABLE ACQUISITIONS

Many Northern Farmers Coming Into This State.

Russell Getting Populist Support. More Convicts. Butler and Russell are Thick. Use the Same Summer Cottage. Cotton Not so Good.

JOURNAL BUREAU, RALEIGH, N. C., Sept. 8. Mr. John T. Patrick of Southern Pines who has been instrumental in bringing emigrants to this State, says he has brought here and settled this year about 400 persons. That they are from the Northern States and all have some property. These new comers have settled in Moore county. There are a good many persons from Pennsylvania settled in Warren county and about 500 more will come there shortly. Southern Pines so widely known owes its existence to Mr. Patrick.

The Progressive Farmer is backing up Governor Russell in his action towards Commissioners J. W. and S. O. Wilson, and some claim that that paper is his weekly organ, but fails to give the name of his daily organ.

The county commissioners have given the Agricultural and Mechanical College scholarships for Wake county to J. S. Weleh, Holly Springs, and Wright Upchurch of Swift creek.

In the report of the authorities it is given that there are 77 county convicts in the work house, and 44 inmates in the poor house.

The penitentiary received an addition of six convicts yesterday. Chairman Dockery of the Board of directors has called a meeting for next week to oust the few remaining Democrats who are there in small offices.

Many applications are still coming in to the State Auditor for pension blanks.

The object of Governor Russell's visit to Wilmington at this particular time is said to be to consult Senator Butler on what disposition shall be made of the two R. R. commissioners who have dared not to plead guilty of any charge his governorship may have charged them with. Senator Butler is spending September with his family in Governor Russell's cottage down on Wrightsville Beach.

The election yesterday resulted in a majority vote, for the issue of the bonds, of 187. This means much for Raleigh.

The revenue collections in this district during August were \$11,786.26. Of this \$70,136 was on whiskey; \$17,232 on cigars and cigarettes; and \$81,867 on tobacco.

The bank made an assignment for benefit creditors and a statement was filed by the officers showing liabilities amounting to fifty-two thousand dollars and assets of fifty-nine thousand dollars.

Christian Science Failed. Special to Journal. WOODSVILLE, N. H., September 8.—The small village of Woodsville is suffering from so-called Christian Science. Mrs. Seth Stickney, twenty five years of age, died last week, and today her child Ruth, aged three years old, died from diphtheria.

Driven Out by the Trust. Special to Journal. DETROIT, September 8.—The tobacco trust has driven the oldest tobacco manufacturer in this country out of business and to the wall.

The American Eagle Tobacco Company assigned to the Union Trust Co. today. Its business commenced to decrease the year the trust was formed. Liabilities, one hundred and fifteen thousand dollars, assets, one hundred and sixty nine thousand dollars.

Wealthy Bostonian Sued. Special to Journal. BOZON, September 8.—W. H. Bates, a wealthy dry goods dealer of Lowell, Mass. is being sued for eighty thousand dollars by Miss Tilly Wetmore of Boston.

Miss Wetmore makes grave accusations against Bates and she says he promised her ten thousand dollars. She accuses him of having her sent to prison when she asked him for money. Bates is married and has seven children.
