

#### HELD UP A TRAIN.

Bold Bandits Take Everything in

Sight. Surprised the Trainmen. Et Reno, Okla., October 1-Bandits obbed the south-bound Rock Island passenger train and all its passengers at 11 o'clock this forenoon at siding No. 1. Street Car Indicator company of Eden as good as a corner lot in a growing about five miles south of Minco, in the

The trainmen were completely surprised and they were not prepared to offer any resistance when five masked men came up to them at the lonely sid ing. The place is uninhabited, and the only persons in the vicinity at the time were four section men. These men flagged the train, the robbers having compelled them to do so. The bandits were hidden at the time in a bruth pile and Jumped out as soon as the passenger train had taken the siding.

Under the presure of Winchesters and ugly-looking six-shooters the trainmen. the express messenger and all of the score or more of passengers, were made to climb down from the train and stand in a line, hands up, on the prairie along the railway.
