The Committee on Foreign Affairs in the Senate is prepared to take an ad vanced position in regard to the Cuban trouble and the relation that this country shall stand in to Spain on account of the recent violent outbreak in Havana.

Enquiries have been made to the Eu ropean powers to learn their probable at titude towards the United States in case this country intervenes in Cuba to put stop to the troubles on the Island, The reply from France is that that

nation will welcome the intervention of the United States The replies from the other powers show that they will remain strictly neutral in
