## THE STATE CAPITAL.

### Instructions to County School Supervisors.

**Railroads Extend no Pass Court- es to Governor. Cattle Killed Account Tuberculosis. Judge Dick's Withdrawal. The Mormon Invasion.**

JOURNAL BUREAU, RALEIGH, N. C., Jan. 15.

Wake county and Mecklenburg county lead in the amount of State taxes paid to the Treasurer. Wake's sheriff paid \$28,244.93, and Mecklenburg \$28,290.65. Thus it will be seen that Mecklenburg leads by \$45.72. Mecklenburg and Wake together show an increase of \$16,487.10 for taxes for 1897 over 1896.

Superintendent Mebane has sent out a circular to the county school supervisors instructing them not to pay any accounts contracted by school committees when there were no funds on hand. Most of these debts were for charts and such things.

The city is being billed for the Primrose and West Minstrels.

The board of directors of the Deaf-Dumb and Blind asylum are to have a conference with Governor Russell to try and find out when the special appropriation of \$57,000 made by the legislature can be paid.

The Governor has made such wild war on the railroads in every way that when the time came to extend yearly courtesies the Governor got left.

Four more cows have been killed from the herd at the Agricultural and Mechanical college for tuberculosis.

A weekly Republican paper is to be started here about February 1st. All sorts of Republicans will have a finger in the pie. It will advocate fusion, will not criticize the policy of any State officer,

The announcement is made that Judge Dick will immediately withdraw from the United States circuit court bench. Supreme court Judge R. M. Douglas, Senator Pritchard and Jas. E. Boyd are all aspirants for the position.

The "Bal Poudre" which was given at the Park Hotel last night by one of the circles of King's Daughters for charity netted the ladies \$60.

The Superior Court which has been in session here this week under the guiding hand of Judge Timberlake adjourned today.

John C. Davis who was to have gone to Washington, after he was dismissed at the insane asylum holds a position at the Caraleigh Cotton mills near this city.

All arrangements for removing the fence from around the Capital are completed and the work will begin in about 10 days. It will help the looks of the square if it is kept properly.

The number of Mormons now working in this State, has reached 50. Six more have just been added to those already here.

The R. R. Commission will meet again on the 25th, and there is but little doubt but what the passenger rate reduction order will be made.

The Cubans have the warmest sympathy here. Many persons declare a fleet ought to be sent to Havana at once.

A telephone line will soon be built between Raleigh and Chapel Hill.

The commission at its next meeting will decide who can and who cannot have passes given them.

Hyacinths are in full bloom out in the yards here and today is like a May day.

## READY FOR HAVANA

If Six Hours Past Without Hearing From Lee.

The Battleship Maine Will Set Sail. Foreign Powers Will Not Object. France is With Us. Great Anxiety in Washington.

WASHINGTON, January, 15th.—The greatest anxiety exists in the Cabinet about the Cuban situation.

The Committee on Foreign Affairs in the Senate is prepared to take an advanced position in regard to the Cuban trouble and the relation that this country shall stand in to Spain on account of the recent violent outbreak in Havana.

Enquiries have been made to the European powers to learn their probable attitude towards the United States in case this country intervenes in Cuba to put a stop to the troubles on the island.

The reply from France is that that nation will welcome the intervention of the United States.

The replies from the other powers show that they will remain strictly neutral in the matter.

That a crisis has arrived is shown by the orders given through the Secretary of War to the commanders of the warships in Southern waters.

The communication of Consul General Fitz Hugh Lee is liable to be cut off at any moment.

This would prevent Lee from calling on the Government in case of need.

The administration has taken a decisive step to protect Lee in such a contingency.

The battleship Maine is ordered to leave Key West for Havana at any time when six hours have elapsed without hearing from Consul General Lee.

The Maine is kept under full steam and is ready to sail for Havana harbor immediately upon the lapse of the specified time.

MADRID, Jan. 14.—The police precautions have been redoubled in the vicinity of the United States legation and around the residence of the United States Minister, General Stewart L. Woodford.

A decree has been published prohibiting the publishing in the daily newspapers of cable dispatches without previous censorship and without twelve hours notice of their receipt.

Violators of the law are warned that they are under military jurisdiction. Another edict will be published shortly forbidding the gathering of groups of more than four persons either in the streets or in the stores.

WASHINGTON, January 14.—As a result of conferences held within the last few days between the silver leaders of various parties, it is understood Chairman Jones of the Democratic National committee; Chairman Butler, of the Populist National committee, and Chairman Towne, of the Silver National Republican committee, will issue a joint manifesto the early part of next week, with a view to securing common action by the three organizations in the Presidential contest.
