AT THE FAIR.

Governor's Guard Likely to Be Present.

Raleigh Graded Schools Attendance. Heavy Sales Fertilizer Tags. Water Dancing. First Meeting in This State. Imposing on Lodges.

JOURNAL BUREAU. RALEIGH, N. C. Feb. 4, '98. Chairman Manly, of the State Democratic Executive Committee, has called a meeting of the committee to be held here February 22nd.

The Secretary of State has chartered the "Wiscasset Mills Co." of Stanly county with capital stock of not less than \$175,000. It is for the manufacture of cotton and woolen goods.

At the Raleigh Graded schools yesterday the enrollment was 2543. During January 345 new pupils were enrolled. There are 1229 white children and 1314 colored at these schools.

The North Carolina Experiment Station will send a delegate to the Pure Food and Drug Congress which is soon to meet in Washington.

The Governor's Guard will attend the Fish, Oyster and Game Fair to be held at New Berne beginning Feb. 28th.

Up to noon yesterday there had been \$1,525 worth of fertilizer tags sold at the Agricultural Department. The sales had been heavy for a few days.

The young men of the A. & M. College are to give a german in the dining room of the Park Hotel tonight, so says a morning paper. A pertinent question is, as to what the costumes of the dancers will be—bathing suits will be most appropriate, as the pipes in the building have burst, and the dining room is flooded.

Skating has been very good here for several days but yesterday a young man well known here struck a thin place on the pond and took a bath.

Interest still increases here as to what the outcome of the meeting of the A. & N. C. R. R. directors tonight will be. There is no telling which way "the cat (Governor Russell) will jump" as to the ousting of Hancock from the presidency of the road. He has been given, by his friend the Governor, plenty of time to make a good fight, but so far his evidence is flimsy.

The Woman's Board of Foreign Missions of the Methodist church will hold its annual meeting in Greensboro the latter part of May. It is composed of the executive officers of the society and the corresponding secretaries of the 45 conference societies. This is the first time the Board has ever met in North Carolina.

A party of 25 Scandinavian editors will pass through here on the 11th. They will breakfast here. They are on a Southern tour.

The executive committee of the Insane Asylum, will leave the selection of a first assistant physician, to succeed the late Dr. Thos. Mott, to the judgment of the Superintendent, Dr. Kirby. He will probably select Dr. Koonce of Jones Co.

There will no doubt be marked out, by the Democratic executive committee, when it meets on the 22nd, a early and heated campaign. Whether the convention will be called to meet here with past experiences for hotel accommodations remains to be seen.

W. A. Guthrie of Durham, the Populist nominee for Governor in 1893 says he believes that free silver will be the supreme issue in the State this year. Republicans do not agree with that idea and Democrats say that State issues will be made supreme.

The subpoena on Maj. Wilson, to appear before the new Commissioners, was not served on him until this week—but he will be with them.

The auditor has sent a warrant for \$500 to the Guilford Battle ground association the appropriation made it by the legislature.

GOVERNOR SHIRKS.

Turns the Hancock Matter Over to His Directors.

No Action Taken. Adjourned Until This Morning. Matters of Business Before the Meeting. Hancock Makes a Statement. Directors Talk.

SPECIAL TO JOURNAL. RALEIGH, February 4.—The directors of the Atlantic and North Carolina railway met at five thirty o'clock in the Executive office.

All the directors were present, save J. M. Morehead of Charlotte. Robt. Hancock presided.

Just before the meeting began Governor Russell entered and said that all present knew of grave charges that were made against President Hancock, but that he left the matter entirely in the directors hands. The Governor then retired and a business meeting was first held.

At the meeting, President Hancock reported that he had closed a contract with the Virginia Bridge Co. to immediately build a steel bridge across the Neuse river at Kinston for forty-eight hundred dollars, and that he had also made a contract for building a depot and warehouse at Dover.

D. W. Patrick, of Snow Hill, said that he was not ready to report on the building of the branch from La Grange to Snow Hill, and he was given further time.

As soon as this business meeting ended Hancock made a statement absolutely denying all the charges made against him by Annie and Gertrude Abbott. His statement was practically as already published. In fact he read most of it. The Directors then adjourned until 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Two of the directors were asked what appeared to be the situation so far as Hancock is concerned and they replied, "Things look mighty bilious for him." Hancock does not appear to be at all worried.
