THAT ELECTION MISTAKE

**Craven Credited with Carteret's
School Election Costs.**

**New Buildings for Blind Asylum.
Those Oyster Claims. Mr. Willard's Will. Cleveland Co.'s
Water Power. Female
Base ballists.**

RALSTON, N. C., Feb. 15.
Articles of incorporation have been filed with the secretary of State for the Latta Martin Pump Company of Hickory with \$24,000 capital.

The curbing of the streets here, which are being so much improved under the efficient street committee, supervision is being purchased from Rowan county. It will be two months before the quarry here can turn out curbing and the street force need the curb right away. About 100 car loads were ordered away, but after that the city will be prepared to furnish its own granite for everything.

At the February meeting of the Daughters of the Revolution here, the subject for discussion this afternoon is "Battle of Guilford Court House."

Bids for the contract for the new dormitory and auditorium, for the Blind Asylum were last night advertised for by the board of directors of that institution.

In the report of the State taxes from Pitt county the sheriff gives \$500—due from cigarettes. Auditor Ayer wrote to see where the mistake was, for that would represent a sale of about 6,000,000 cigarettes in that one county.

Dr. Abbott of the rail road commission has not allowed Governor Russell or his commissioner Pearson (posing as the Democratic member of the commission) to stop his subpoenas for full investigation, as to whether all the roads have violated the law as to special rates to hotels. Yesterday he wrote the subpoenas himself, and gave part of them to the Sheriff here, to be served upon Seaboard officials, and hotel men.

Auditor Ayer refuses to meet the claims in the oyster dispute in Pamlico and Carteret counties. The Supreme Court rendered a decision, some time ago that the State was liable for this money. Auditor Ayer does not deny this but he says that there is no legal provision for such debts, and he declines to issue warrants for their payments. He says the claimants must appeal to the legislature to make an appropriation to meet these claims. There are 100 in Carteret and about 800 in Pamlico who make claims, and these claims amount to about \$5,500. The auditor says he will this week publish a list of the claimants, showing that some of the claimants have been dead for 10 years, and that there are others who now live in Raleigh, and never owned an oyster bed in their lives.

The will of the late Mr. Willard was probated yesterday. The estate is valued at \$118,000.

The board of directors of the blind asylum last night ordered new pianos bought, and the bids for the new building were not to be over \$20,000, and for the equipment \$2,000.

The Superintendent of public instruction in giving out the costs in the different counties for holding the special school tax election gave the cost in Craven county at \$900. By mistake he said Craven where it should have been Carteret. No election was held in Craven. State Labor Commissioner Hamrick finds upon examination of the water power in Cleveland county, that one stream affords power to operate 120,000 spindles.

Three female base ball teams are heading this way to play here in May and June. One is from Rhode Island and one from Connecticut.

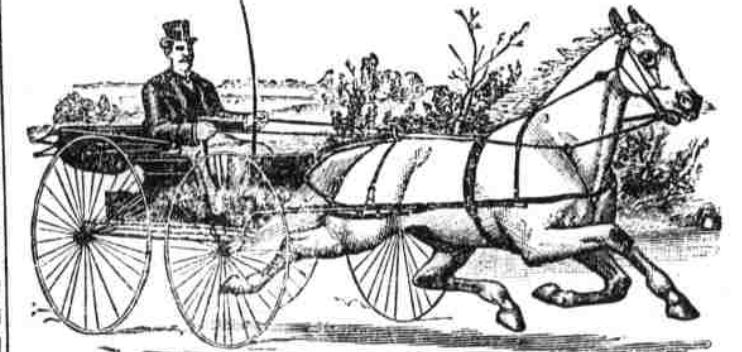
